## Associations of "Debriefing" (30 Words)

<b>advert</b>	An advertisement.
<b>assemblage</b>	Several things grouped together or considered as a whole. <i>Some vast <b>assemblage</b> of gears and cogs.</i>
<b><u>assembly</u></b>	A group of people elected to make laws or decisions for a particular country or region. <i>He was told off for talking in <b>assembly</b>.</i>
<b>associational</b>	Of or relating to associations or associationism.
<b><u>attend</u></b>	Pay attention to. <i>The children in the audience <b>attended</b> the recital quietly.</i>
<b>attendee</b>	A person who attends a conference or other gathering. <i>The gathering satisfied both organizers and <b>attendees</b>.</i>
<b><u>audible</u></b>	A football play is changed orally after both teams have assumed their positions at the line of scrimmage. <i>He saw two safeties sneaking up and called an <b>audible</b>.</i>
<b>audience</b>	An opportunity to state your case and be heard. <i>The programme attracted an <b>audience</b> of almost twenty million.</i>
<b><u>brief</u></b>	Instruct a barrister by brief. <i>A pair of extremely <b>brief</b> black shorts.</i>
<b><u>conference</u></b>	Take part in a conference or conference call. <i>I <b>conferenced</b> with a senior analyst at the Congressional Research Service.</i>
<b>congress</b>	A national legislative assembly. <i>An international <b>congress</b> of mathematicians.</i>
<b>consult</b>	An act of consulting a professional a consultation. <i>Patients are entitled to be <b>consulted</b> about their treatment.</i>
<b><u>convene</u></b>	Come or bring together for a meeting or activity; assemble. <i>The students were <b>convened</b> in the auditorium.</i>

<b>conversation</b>	A talk, especially an informal one, between two or more people, in which news and ideas are exchanged. <i>The two men were deep in <b>conversation</b>.</i>
<b>convocation</b>	A group gathered in response to a summons. <i>The arguments delayed the <b>convocation</b> of the first congress planned for February 1992.</i>
<b>convoke</b>	Call together. <i>She sent messages <b>convoking</b> a Council of Ministers.</i>
<b>gathering</b>	The act of gathering something. <i>A family <b>gathering</b>.</i>
<b>listen</b>	An act of listening to something. <i>If I've had a stressful day I love to chill out and <b>listen</b> to music.</i>
<b>meeting</b>	A formally arranged gathering. <i>There was an informal <b>meeting</b> in my living room.</i>
<b>minutes</b>	A written account of what transpired at a meeting.
<b>overhear</b>	Hear (someone or something) without meaning to or without the knowledge of the speaker. <i>We <b>overheard</b> the conversation at the next table.</i>
<b>pithiness</b>	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<b>plenary</b>	Full in all respects. <i>The following speakers will present <b>plenary</b> addresses at the conference.</i>
<b>report</b>	Be responsible for reporting the details of as in journalism. <i>The <b>report</b> of his speech.</i>
<b><u>seminar</u></b>	A class at university in which a topic is discussed by a teacher and a small group of students. <i>A <b>seminar</b> group of sixteen students.</i>
<b><u>session</u></b>	A period of recording music in a studio especially by a session musician. <i>The governor called this week's special <b>session</b> to reconsider the decision.</i>
<b><u>snapshot</u></b>	A record of the contents of a storage location or data file at a given time. <i>A collection of family <b>snapshots</b>.</i>
<b><u>speaker</u></b>	A person who speaks a specified language. <i>The two <b>speakers</b> let the netbook feature stereo sound.</i>
<b>succinctness</b>	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<b>uninformative</b>	Not providing particularly useful or interesting information. <i>The coverage is brief and <b>uninformative</b>.</i>
