beginning	The time at which something is supposed to begin. <i>They had reached the beginning of the wood.</i>
coming out	Arrival that has been awaited (especially of something momentous).
<u>entrance</u>	An act or instance of entering somewhere. <i>Her final entrance is as a triumphant princess.</i>
entry	Something that provides access (to get in or get out). <i>Sophisticated features to help ensure accurate data entry.</i>
first appearance	The first or highest in an ordering or series.
first performance	The fielding position of the player on a baseball team who is stationed at first of the bases in the infield (counting counterclockwise from home plate).
first showing	The fielding position of the player on a baseball team who is stationed at first of the bases in the infield (counting counterclockwise from home plate).

inauguration	The act of starting a new operation or practice. <i>The new president obviously enjoyed his inauguration.</i>
<u>inception</u>	An event that is a beginning; a first part or stage of subsequent events. <i>She has been on the board since its inception two years ago.</i>
introduction	A basic or elementary instructional text. <i>Despite the new introductions many of the older species remain firm favourites.</i>
launch	An act or instance of launching something. <i>The launch of a new campaign against drinking and driving.</i>
launching	The act of moving a newly built vessel into the water for the first time.
premiere	The first public performance of a play or movie. <i>The world premiere of his new play.</i>
unveiling	The presentation or announcement of something in public for the first time. <i>The unveiling of the government's new economic plan.</i>

<u>actor</u>	A person who behaves in a way that is not genuine. <i>He is a principal actor in this affair.</i>
actress	A woman who behaves in a way that is not genuine. <i>I became a very good actress and they nearly always believed me.</i>
album	A collection of recordings issued as a single item on CD, record, or another medium. <i>His debut album was very much influenced by the jazz sound.</i>
<u>blockbuster</u>	A thing of great power or size, in particular a film, book, or other product that is a great commercial success. <i>A blockbuster film.</i>
casting	The act of creating something by casting it in a mold. <i>Bronze castings.</i>
<u>celebrity</u>	The state of being well known. <i>He became a sporting celebrity.</i>

cinema	A theatre where films are shown for public entertainment. <i>One of the giants of British cinema.</i>
cinematic	Of or pertaining to or characteristic of the cinema. <i>The cinematic feel of their video.</i>
comedian	An actor in a comedy. <i>They sat watching an Irish comedian telling jokes.</i>
film	Record in film. <i>An adventure story which would film well.</i>
first	The fielding position of the player on a baseball team who is stationed at first of the bases in the infield counting counterclockwise from home plate. <i>The first meetings of the new party.</i>
flick	Cause to move with a flick. <i>He flicked his Bic.</i>
impresario	A sponsor who books and stages public entertainments.
introduction	A basic or elementary instructional text. <i>The introduction of muskrats into central Europe.</i>
minstrel	A performer in a minstrel show. <i>The exaggerated dialect of blackface minstrels.</i>
movie	Films generally or the film industry. <i>A movie star.</i>
nickelodeon	A cabinet containing an automatic record player; records are played by inserting a coin.
performer	An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience. <i>A circus performer.</i>
picture	Show in or as in a picture. <i>She pictured Benjamin waiting.</i>
premiere	The first performance of a musical or theatrical work or the first showing of a film. <i>We premiered the opera of the young composer and it was a critical success.</i>
preview	A publicity article or review of a forthcoming film, book, etc., based on an advance viewing. <i>The preview shows a scene not included in the actual film.</i>
projector	A device that is used to project rays of light, especially an apparatus with a system of lenses for projecting slides or film on to a screen. <i>He was a tobacco grower and projector.</i>

- screen** A windscreen of a motor vehicle.
*The Special Branch man remained hidden behind the **screen** for prosecution witnesses.*
- screening** The testing of a person or group of people for the presence of a disease or other condition.
*Nowhere is drug **screening** more common than in the federal criminal justice system.*
- superman** A man with exceptional physical or mental ability.
*Appearing in that number of races would have taxed the strength of a **superman**.*
- supermodel** A fashion model who has attained the status of a celebrity.
- theater** A building where theatrical performances or motion-picture shows can be presented.
*He served in the Vietnam **theater** for three years.*
- troupe** Organization of performers and associated personnel (especially theatrical).
*A dance **troupe**.*
- vaudeville** A satirical or topical song with a refrain.
*A stage show with **vaudeville** acts and dancing girls.*
- video** A recording of moving visual images made digitally or on videotape.
*He set the **video**.*
