coming out	Arrival that has been awaited (especially of something momentous.

entry	Something that provides access (to get in or get out. Sophisticated features to help ensure accurate data <b>entry</b> .
first appearance	The first or highest in an ordering or series.
first performance	The fielding position of the player on a baseball team who is stationed at first of the bases in the infield (counting counterclockwise from home plate.
first showing	The fielding position of the player on a baseball team who is stationed at first of the bases in the infield (counting counterclockwise from home plate.



inauguration	The act of starting a new operation or practice. The new president obviously enjoyed his <b>inauguration</b> .
inception	An event that is a beginning; a first part or stage of subsequent events. She has been on the board since its <b>inception</b> two years ago.
introduction	A basic or elementary instructional text. Despite the new <b>introduction</b> s many of the older species remain firm favourites.
launch	An act or instance of launching something. The <b>launch</b> of a new campaign against drinking and driving.
launching	The act of moving a newly built vessel into the water for the first time.
premiere	The first public performance of a play or movie. The world <b>premiere</b> of his new play.
unveiling	The presentation or announcement of something in public for the first time. The <b>unveiling</b> of the government s new economic plan.

<u>actor</u>	A person who behaves in a way that is not genuine. <i>He s a principal <b>actor</b> in this affair.</i>
actress	A woman who behaves in a way that is not genuine. I became a very good <b>actress</b> and they nearly always believed me.
album	A collection of recordings issued as a single item on CD, record, or another medium. His debut <b>album</b> was very much influenced by the jazz sound.
<u>blockbuster</u>	A thing of great power or size, in particular a film, book, or other product that is a great commercial success. A <b>blockbuster</b> film.
casting	The act of creating something by casting it in a mold. Bronze <b>casting</b> s.
<u>celebrity</u>	The state of being well known. <i>He became a sporting <b>celebrity</b>.</i>



<u>cinema</u>	A theatre where films are shown for public entertainment. One of the giants of British <b>cinema</b> .
cinematic	Of or pertaining to or characteristic of the cinema. <i>The cinematic feel of their video.</i>
comedian	An actor in a comedy. They sat watching an Irish <b>comedian</b> telling jokes.
film	Record in film. An adventure story which would <b>film</b> well.
first	The fielding position of the player on a baseball team who is stationed at first of the bases in the infield counting counterclockwise from home plate. <i>The first meetings of the new party.</i>
flick	Cause to move with a flick. <i>He <b>flick</b>ed his Bic.</i>
impresario	A sponsor who books and stages public entertainments.
introduction	A basic or elementary instructional text. The <b>introduction</b> of muskrats into central Europe.
minstrel	A performer in a minstrel show. The exaggerated dialect of blackface <b>minstrel</b> s.
movie	Films generally or the film industry. A <b>movie</b> star.
nickelodeon	A cabinet containing an automatic record player; records are played by inserting a coin.
performer	An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience. <i>A circus <b>performer</b></i> .
picture	Show in or as in a picture. She <b>picture</b> d Benjamin waiting.
premiere	The first performance of a musical or theatrical work or the first showing of a film. We <b>premiere</b> d the opera of the young composer and it was a critical success.
preview	A publicity article or review of a forthcoming film, book, etc., based on an advance viewing. The <b>preview</b> shows a scene not included in the actual film.
projector	A device that is used to project rays of light, especially an apparatus with a system of lenses for projecting slides or film on to a screen. <i>He was a tobacco grower and <b>projector</b>.</i>



<u>screen</u>	A windscreen of a motor vehicle. <i>The Special Branch man remained hidden behind the</i> <b>screen</b> <i>for prosecution</i> <i>witnesses.</i>
<u>screening</u>	The testing of a person or group of people for the presence of a disease or other condition. Nowhere is drug <b>screening</b> more common than in the federal criminal justice system.
superman	A man with exceptional physical or mental ability. Appearing in that number of races would have taxed the strength of a <b>superman</b> .
supermodel	A fashion model who has attained the status of a celebrity.
<u>theater</u>	A building where theatrical performances or motion-picture shows can be presented. <i>He served in the Vietnam <b>theater</b> for three years.</i>
troupe	Organization of performers and associated personnel (especially theatrical. <i>A dance troupe</i> .
vaudeville	A satirical or topical song with a refrain. A stage show with <b>vaudeville</b> acts and dancing girls.
video	A recording of moving visual images made digitally or on videotape. <i>He set the <b>video</b></i> .
