<b>beginning</b>	The time at which something is supposed to begin. <i>They had reached the <b>beginning</b> of the wood.</i>
<b>coming out</b>	Arrival that has been awaited (especially of something momentous).
<b><u>entrance</u></b>	An act or instance of entering somewhere. <i>Her final <b>entrance</b> is as a triumphant princess.</i>
<b>entry</b>	Something that provides access (to get in or get out). <i>Sophisticated features to help ensure accurate data <b>entry</b>.</i>
<b>first appearance</b>	The first or highest in an ordering or series.
<b>first performance</b>	The fielding position of the player on a baseball team who is stationed at first of the bases in the infield (counting counterclockwise from home plate).
<b>first showing</b>	The fielding position of the player on a baseball team who is stationed at first of the bases in the infield (counting counterclockwise from home plate).

<b>inauguration</b>	The act of starting a new operation or practice. <i>The new president obviously enjoyed his <b>inauguration</b>.</i>
<b><u>inception</u></b>	An event that is a beginning; a first part or stage of subsequent events. <i>She has been on the board since its <b>inception</b> two years ago.</i>
<b>introduction</b>	A basic or elementary instructional text. <i>Despite the new <b>introductions</b> many of the older species remain firm favourites.</i>
<b>launch</b>	An act or instance of launching something. <i>The <b>launch</b> of a new campaign against drinking and driving.</i>
<b>launching</b>	The act of moving a newly built vessel into the water for the first time.
<b>premiere</b>	The first public performance of a play or movie. <i>The world <b>premiere</b> of his new play.</i>
<b>unveiling</b>	The presentation or announcement of something in public for the first time. <i>The <b>unveiling</b> of the government's new economic plan.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Debut" as a noun

- The film marked his debut as a director.
- They looked forward to the debut of their new product line.

## Associations of "Debut" (30 Words)

<b><u>actor</u></b>	A person who behaves in a way that is not genuine. <i>He's a principal <b>actor</b> in this affair.</i>
<b>actress</b>	A woman who behaves in a way that is not genuine. <i>I became a very good <b>actress</b> and they nearly always believed me.</i>
<b>album</b>	A collection of recordings issued as a single item on CD, record, or another medium. <i>His debut <b>album</b> was very much influenced by the jazz sound.</i>
<b><u>blockbuster</u></b>	A thing of great power or size, in particular a film, book, or other product that is a great commercial success. <i>A <b>blockbuster</b> film.</i>
<b>casting</b>	The act of creating something by casting it in a mold. <i>Bronze <b>castings</b>.</i>
<b><u>celebrity</u></b>	The state of being well known. <i>He became a sporting <b>celebrity</b>.</i>

<b>cinema</b>	A theatre where films are shown for public entertainment. <i>One of the giants of British <b>cinema</b>.</i>
<b>cinematic</b>	Of or pertaining to or characteristic of the cinema. <i>The <b>cinematic</b> feel of their video.</i>
<b>comedian</b>	An actor in a comedy. <i>They sat watching an Irish <b>comedian</b> telling jokes.</i>
<b>film</b>	Record in film. <i>An adventure story which would <b>film</b> well.</i>
<b>first</b>	The fielding position of the player on a baseball team who is stationed at first of the bases in the infield counting counterclockwise from home plate. <i>The <b>first</b> meetings of the new party.</i>
<b>flick</b>	Cause to move with a flick. <i>He <b>flicked</b> his Bic.</i>
<b>impresario</b>	A sponsor who books and stages public entertainments.
<b>introduction</b>	A basic or elementary instructional text. <i>The <b>introduction</b> of muskrats into central Europe.</i>
<b>minstrel</b>	A performer in a minstrel show. <i>The exaggerated dialect of blackface <b>minstrels</b>.</i>
<b>movie</b>	Films generally or the film industry. <i>A <b>movie</b> star.</i>
<b>nickelodeon</b>	A cabinet containing an automatic record player; records are played by inserting a coin.
<b>performer</b>	An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience. <i>A circus <b>performer</b>.</i>
<b>picture</b>	Show in or as in a picture. <i>She <b>pictured</b> Benjamin waiting.</i>
<b>premiere</b>	The first performance of a musical or theatrical work or the first showing of a film. <i>We <b>premiered</b> the opera of the young composer and it was a critical success.</i>
<b>preview</b>	A publicity article or review of a forthcoming film, book, etc., based on an advance viewing. <i>The <b>preview</b> shows a scene not included in the actual film.</i>
<b>projector</b>	A device that is used to project rays of light, especially an apparatus with a system of lenses for projecting slides or film on to a screen. <i>He was a tobacco grower and <b>projector</b>.</i>

<b>screen</b>	A windscreen of a motor vehicle. <i>The Special Branch man remained hidden behind the <b>screen</b> for prosecution witnesses.</i>
<b>screening</b>	The testing of a person or group of people for the presence of a disease or other condition. <i>Nowhere is drug <b>screening</b> more common than in the federal criminal justice system.</i>
<b>superman</b>	A man with exceptional physical or mental ability. <i>Appearing in that number of races would have taxed the strength of a <b>superman</b>.</i>
<b>supermodel</b>	A fashion model who has attained the status of a celebrity.
<b>theater</b>	A building where theatrical performances or motion-picture shows can be presented. <i>He served in the Vietnam <b>theater</b> for three years.</i>
<b>troupe</b>	Organization of performers and associated personnel (especially theatrical). <i>A dance <b>troupe</b>.</i>
<b>vaudeville</b>	A satirical or topical song with a refrain. <i>A stage show with <b>vaudeville</b> acts and dancing girls.</i>
<b>video</b>	A recording of moving visual images made digitally or on videotape. <i>He set the <b>video</b>.</i>
