eraser A piece of soft rubber or plastic used to rub out something written.

excision The act of pulling up or out; uprooting; cutting off from existence.

extirpate Surgically remove (an organ.

obviate Do away with.

The presence of roller blinds **obviate**d the need for curtains.

Completely destroy (a building, town, or other settlement.

Villages were **raze**d to the ground.

Remove from a position or an office.

He removed his children to the countryside.

Without pity or compassion for others.

ruthlesslyThey fell prey to money lenders who **ruthlessly** exploited them.

Spend thoughtlessly; throw away.

squander
