severe.

language.

disassemble

It is permissible for a lawful user to disassemble a computer program to

determine its interfaces.

**dishand** Stop functioning or cohering as a unit.

The principal **disband**ed the political student organization.

**disintegrate** Lose a stored charge, magnetic flux, or current.

dismantle Tear down so as to make flat with the ground.

The old regime was **dismantle**d.

dismember Partition or divide up (a territory or organization.

**dissolution** Separation into component parts. *An advanced state of dissolution.*

She suddenly **dissolve**d into floods of tears.

erosive Wearing away by friction.

The **erosive** effects of waves on the shoreline.

foul In sport commit a foul against an opponent.

The weather turned **foul**.

iron A shot made with an iron.

The **iron** grip of the president on every aspect of foreign policy.

malodorous Smelling very unpleasant.

Leaking taps and **malodorous** drains.

molder Break down.

Liable to perish; subject to destruction or death or decay.

**perishable** The shipment was delivered eventually though some of the **perishable**s

had gone off.

putrefaction (biology) the process of decay caused by bacterial or fungal action.

The breeze shifted and we caught the stench of **putrefaction**.

putrescent Undergoing the process of decay; rotting.

The odour of **putrescent** flesh.

putrid

In an advanced state of decomposition and having a foul odor.

A butcher who sold **putrid** meat.

Rotten or decayed matter.

The leaves were turning black with **rot**.

Very bad.

She tried to tell me she felt **rotten**.

solvable Capable of being solved.

Such problems are perfectly **solvable**.

**spoilage** Waste produced by material being spoilt, especially paper that is spoilt in

printing.
