## Dedication as a Noun

### Definitions of "Dedication" as a noun

- *An inscription or form of words dedicating a building, book, etc. to a person or deity.*
- *A ceremony in which something (as a building) is dedicated to some goal or purpose.*
- *A message that makes a pledge.*
- *Complete and wholehearted fidelity.*
- *The quality of being dedicated or committed to a task or purpose.*
- *The action of dedicating a church or other building.*
- *A short message (as in a book or musical work or on a photograph) dedicating it to someone or something.*
- *The act of binding yourself (intellectually or emotionally) to a course of action.*

### **address**

The place where someone lives or an organization is situated.  
*They exchanged **addresses** and agreed to keep in touch.*

### **adherence**

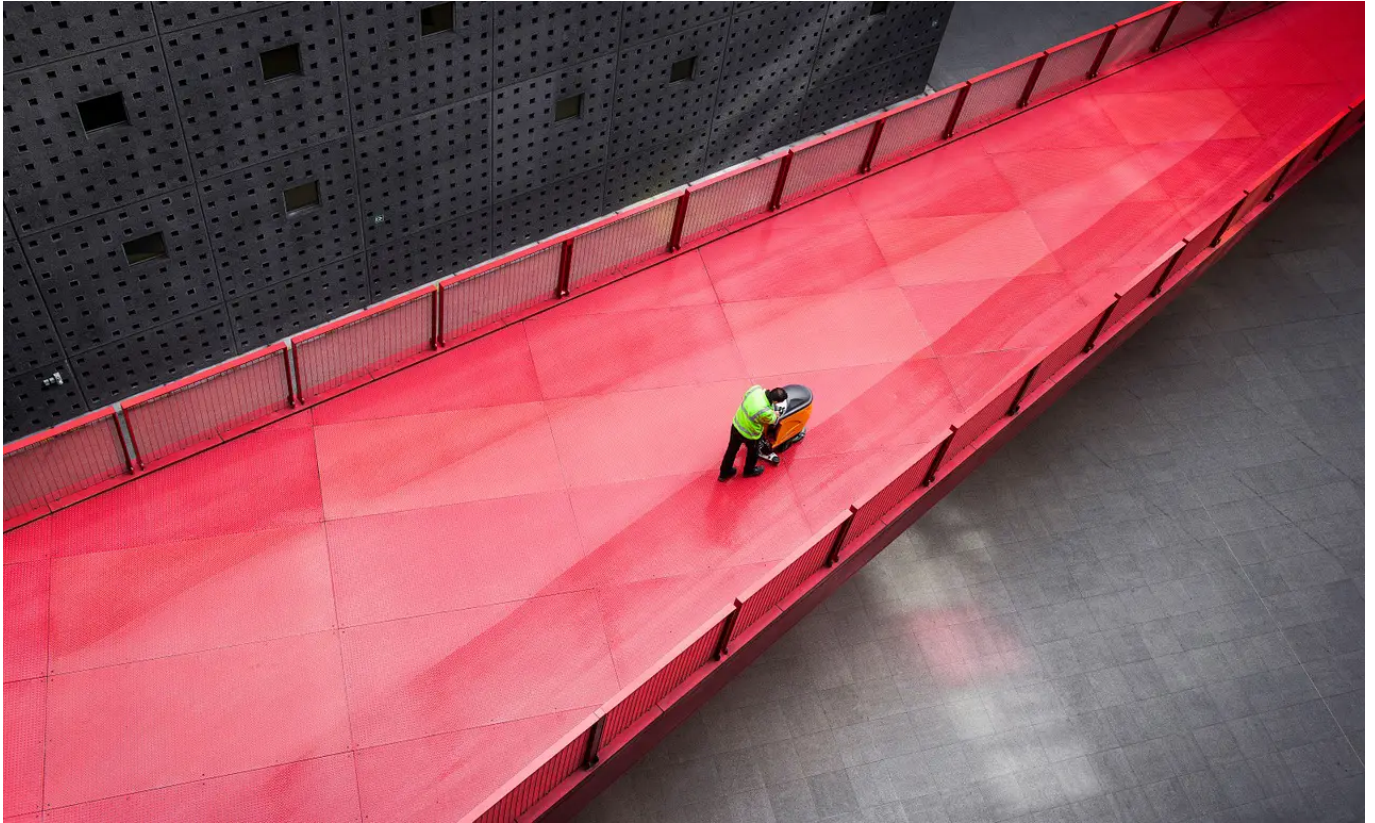
The property of sticking together (as of glue and wood) or the joining of surfaces of different composition.  
*Observing the **adherence** of the seeds to clothing prompted the development of Velcro.*

### **allegiance**

The loyalty that citizens owe to their country (or subjects to their sovereign).  
*Those wishing to receive citizenship must swear **allegiance** to the republic.*

<b>application</b>	A formal request to be considered for a position or to be allowed to do or have something, submitted to an authority, institution, or organization. <i>The doctor prescribed a topical <b>application</b> of iodine.</i>
<b>assiduity</b>	Constant attentions to someone. <i>The <b>assiduity</b> with which he could wear down his opponents.</i>
<b>backbone</b>	The series of vertebrae forming the axis of the skeleton and protecting the spinal cord. <i>He has enough <b>backbone</b> to see us through this difficulty.</i>
<b>benediction</b>	The state of being blessed. <i>He said the <b>benediction</b>.</i>
<b>blessing</b>	A beneficial thing for which one is grateful. <i>It s a <b>blessing</b> we re alive.</i>
<b><u>commitment</u></b>	The state or quality of being dedicated to a cause, activity, etc. <i>The company s <b>commitment</b> to quality.</i>
<b>conscientiousness</b>	The trait of being painstaking and careful. <i>His <b>conscientiousness</b> is second to none and he regularly makes follow up calls to ensure everything is going well.</i>
<b>consecration</b>	(religion) sanctification of something by setting it apart (usually with religious rites) as dedicated to God. <i>The <b>consecration</b> of this cathedral was a magical event.</i>
<b>constancy</b>	The quality of being enduring and unchanging. <i>The <b>constancy</b> of the tradition.</i>
<b>devotedness</b>	Commitment to some purpose. <i>Many of the gentry were won by his undoubted sincerity and <b>devotedness</b>.</i>
<b><u>devotion</u></b>	Prayers or religious observances. <i>His <b>devotion</b> to duty never wavered.</i>
<b><u>diligence</u></b>	A diligent effort. <i>Few party members challenge his <b>diligence</b> as an MP.</i>
<b>doggedness</b>	Persistent determination.
<b><u>drive</u></b>	Hitting a golf ball off of a tee with a driver. <i>Cattle were no longer taken on long <b>drives</b> but were delivered by rail.</i>
<b>enthusiasm</b>	Something that arouses enthusiasm. <i>Her energy and <b>enthusiasm</b> for life.</i>
<b>faithfulness</b>	The quality of being faithful. <i><b>Faithfulness</b> in marriage.</i>

<b>industry</b>	Economic activity concerned with the processing of raw materials and manufacture of goods in factories. <i>The kitchen became a hive of <b>industry</b>.</i>
<b>inscription</b>	Letters inscribed (especially words engraved or carved) on something. <i>The <b>inscription</b> on her headstone.</i>
<b>loyalty</b>	The act of binding yourself (intellectually or emotionally) to a course of action. <i>They felt no <b>loyalty</b> to a losing team.</i>
<b>message</b>	What a communication that is about something is about. <i>We ll be back after these <b>messages</b>.</i>
<b>perseverance</b>	Persistent determination. <i>Medicine is a field which requires dedication and <b>perseverance</b>.</i>
<b>persistence</b>	The fact of continuing in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition. <i>Cardiff s <b>persistence</b> was rewarded with a try.</i>
<b>purposefulness</b>	The quality of having a definite purpose.
<b>resoluteness</b>	The trait of being resolute. <i>His <b>resoluteness</b> carried him through the battle.</i>
<b>resolve</b>	Firm determination to do something. <i>She received information that strengthened her <b>resolve</b>.</i>
<b>sanctification</b>	The action of causing something to be or seem morally right or acceptable. <i>The process of <b>sanctification</b> takes deliberate action on our part.</i>
<b>sedulousness</b>	The quality of being constantly diligent and attentive.
<b>single-mindedness</b>	Characterized by one unified purpose.
<b>staunchness</b>	Loyalty in the face of trouble and difficulty.
<b>staying power</b>	Brace consisting of a heavy rope or wire cable used as a support for a mast or spar.
<b>tenacity</b>	The quality or fact of being very determined; determination. <i>The sheer <b>tenacity</b> of the limpet.</i>
<b>wholeheartedness</b>	The quality of hearty sincerity.
<b>zeal</b>	Prompt willingness. <i>He felt a kind of religious <b>zeal</b>.</i>

<b>confidence</b>	Freedom from doubt; belief in yourself and your abilities. <i>He would walk up those steps with a <b>confidence</b> he didn't feel.</i>
<b>confiding</b>	Willing to entrust personal matters. <i>She was in a <b>confiding</b> mood.</i>
<b>credibility</b>	The quality of being trusted and believed in. <i>The government's loss of <b>credibility</b>.</i>
<b>credo</b>	A statement of the beliefs or aims which guide someone's actions. <i>He announced his <b>credo</b> in his first editorial.</i>
<b>credulity</b>	Tendency to believe readily. <i>Moneylenders prey upon their <b>credulity</b> and inexperience.</i>
<b>devotion</b>	(usually plural) religious observance or prayers (usually spoken silently). <i>The <b>devotion</b> of his time and wealth to science.</i>
<b>encyclical</b>	A letter from the pope sent to all Roman Catholic bishops throughout the world. <i>An <b>encyclical</b> letter.</i>
<b>faith</b>	Strong belief in the doctrines of a religion, based on spiritual conviction rather than proof. <i>Bereaved people who have shown supreme <b>faith</b>.</i>
<b>faithful</b>	Those who are faithful to a particular religion or political party. <i>My <b>faithful</b> compass.</i>
<b>faithfully</b>	In a loyal manner. <i>It always came on <b>faithfully</b> like the radio.</i>
<b>faithfulness</b>	The quality of being faithful. <i><b>Faithfulness</b> in marriage.</i>
<b>fidelity</b>	Faithfulness to a person, cause, or belief, demonstrated by continuing loyalty and support. <i>The 1949 recording provides reasonable <b>fidelity</b>.</i>
<b>loyal</b>	Unwavering in devotion to friend or vow or cause. <i><b>Loyal</b> subjects.</i>
<b>loyalty</b>	The quality of being loyal. <i>His extreme <b>loyalty</b> to the Crown.</i>
<b>oblation</b>	The act of contributing to the funds of a church or charity. <i><b>Oblations</b> for aid to the poor.</i>
<b>piety</b>	The quality of being religious or reverent. <i>Acts of <b>piety</b> and charity.</i>
<b>sincerity</b>	The trait of being serious- Robert Rice. <i>His <b>sincerity</b> inspired belief.</i>

- subservience** In a subservient state.  
*Is it a case of the **subservience** of the divine to political beliefs.*
- theism** Belief in the existence of a god or gods, specifically of a creator who intervenes in the universe.  
*There are many different forms of **theism**.*
- troth** Truth.  
*A token of **troth**.*
- trusted** Worthy of trust or confidence.  
*A sure or **trusted** friend.*
- trustful** Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust.  
*A **trustful** acceptance of authority.*
- trusting** Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust.  
*A shy and **trusting** child.*
- unswerving** Not changing or becoming weaker; steady or constant.  
*A straight and narrow tree lined road **unswerving** across the lowlands.*
