account	To give an account or representation of in words. <i>Her visit could not be accounted a success.</i>
adjudge	Consider or declare to be true or the case. <i>She was adjudged guilty.</i>
calculate to be	Make a mathematical calculation or computation.
class as	Arrange or order by classes or categories.
consider	Show consideration for take into account. <i>I consider her to be shallow.</i>

count	Include as if by counting. <i>It did not matter what the audience thought it was the critics that counted.</i>
esteem	Consider; deem. <i>I should esteem it a favour if you could speak to them.</i>
estimate as	Judge tentatively or form an estimate of (quantities or time).
find	Make a discovery make a new finding. <i>Lindsey looked up to find Neil watching her.</i>
gauge	Measure the dimensions of an object with a gauge. <i>When dry the assemblies can be gauged exactly and planed to width.</i>
hold	Hold the attention of. <i>The flask holds one gallon.</i>
hold to be	Keep in a certain state, position, or activity.
interpret as	Make sense of a language.
judge	Put on trial or hear a case and sit as the judge at the trial of. <i>It is hard to judge whether such opposition is justified.</i>
look on as	Perceive with attention; direct one's gaze towards.
rate	Be worthy of; merit. <i>The program has been rated a great success.</i>
reckon	Consider or regard in a specified way. <i>In college he was always reckoned among the brainiest.</i>
regard as	Connect closely and often incriminatingly.
see as	Perceive or be contemporaneous with.
suppose	Expect believe or suppose. <i>I shouldn't have been in the study I'm not supposed to go in there.</i>
take for	Take on a certain form, attribute, or aspect.
take to be	Take something or somebody with oneself somewhere.
view as	Look at carefully; study mentally.

Usage Examples of "Deem" as a verb

- *The strike was deemed to be illegal.*

anticipatory	In anticipation. <i>An anticipatory flash of excitement.</i>
assuming	Excessively forward. <i>On a subject like this it would be too assuming for me to decide.</i>
brood	A family of birds or other young animals produced at one hatching or birth. <i>Birds brood.</i>
cogitate	Consider carefully and deeply; reflect upon; turn over in one's mind. <i>He stroked his beard and retired to cogitate.</i>
consider	Take into consideration for exemplifying purposes. <i>I consider him irresponsible.</i>
consideration	A fact or a motive taken into account in deciding something. <i>He showed no consideration for her feelings.</i>
contemplate	Consider as a possibility. <i>Contemplate one's navel.</i>
infer	Believe to be the case. <i>From these facts we can infer that crime has been increasing.</i>
inference	The process of inferring something. <i>It seemed a fair inference that such books would be grouped together.</i>
intend	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>A series of questions intended as a checklist.</i>
intentionality	Expressive of intentions.
logically	According to logical reasoning. <i>These suggestions are logically impossible.</i>
mistakenly	By accident or oversight; accidentally. <i>He mistakenly believed it.</i>
mull	An island in western Scotland in the Inner Hebrides. <i>The government is mulling an overhaul of outdated insurance laws.</i>
muse	A person or personified force who is the source of inspiration for a creative artist. <i>Euterpe was his muse.</i>
opine	Hold and state as one's opinion. <i>The man is a genius he opined.</i>

<u>optimistically</u>	In a way that shows hope and confidence about the future. <i>The bank optimistically predicts an economic growth rate of 5 percent.</i>
<u>ponder</u>	Think about (something) carefully, especially before making a decision or reaching a conclusion. <i>I pondered the question of what clothes to wear for the occasion.</i>
ponderable	Having appreciable weight or significance. <i>Something ponderable from the outer world something of which we can say that its weight is so and so.</i>
reckon	Expect, believe, or suppose. <i>I don't reckon his chances.</i>
<u>reconsider</u>	Consider (something) again, especially for a possible change of decision regarding it. <i>They called on the US government to reconsider its policy.</i>
<u>reflect</u>	Be bright by reflecting or casting light. <i>When the sun's rays hit the Earth a lot of the heat is reflected back into space.</i>
regard	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>He shifted uneasily before their clear regard.</i>
<u>reminisce</u>	Recall the past. <i>They reminisced about their summers abroad.</i>
<u>ruminate</u>	Think deeply about something. <i>Cows ruminate.</i>
<u>speculate</u>	Form a theory or conjecture about a subject without firm evidence. <i>Philosophers have speculated on the question of God for thousands of years.</i>
think	An act of thinking. <i>Can you think what to do next.</i>
thoughtfulness	Kind and considerate regard for others. <i>The jury was impressed by the thoughtfulness of the project.</i>
wrongheaded	Obstinately perverse in judgment or opinion. <i>A wrongheaded policy.</i>
