<b>according</b>	In proportion or relation to. <i>Cook the rice <b>according</b> to the instructions.</i>
<b><a href="#">anticipatory</a></b>	(of a breach of contract) taking the form of an announcement or indication that a contract will not be honoured. <i>An <b>anticipatory</b> flash of excitement.</i>
<b>assuming</b>	Arrogant or presumptuous. <i>On a subject like this it would be too <b>assuming</b> for me to decide.</i>
<b><a href="#">brood</a></b>	Hang over, as of something threatening, dark, or menacing. <i>A <b>brood</b> of chicks.</i>
<b>cogitate</b>	Consider carefully and deeply; reflect upon; turn over in one’s mind. <i>He stroked his beard and retired to <b>cogitate</b>.</i>
<b>consider</b>	Show consideration for take into account. <i>All three patients were <b>considered</b> to be in a critical condition.</i>
<b>consideration</b>	Kind and considerate regard for others. <i>Your case needs very careful investigation and <b>consideration</b>.</i>
<b>contemplate</b>	Think deeply and at length. <i>He <b>contemplated</b> his image in the mirrors.</i>
<b><a href="#">infer</a></b>	Conclude by reasoning; in logic. <i>From these facts we can <b>infer</b> that crime has been increasing.</i>
<b>inference</b>	The reasoning involved in drawing a conclusion or making a logical judgment on the basis of circumstantial evidence and prior conclusions rather than on the basis of direct observation. <i>Researchers are entrusted with drawing <b>inferences</b> from the data.</i>
<b><a href="#">intend</a></b>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>Pigs <b>intended</b> for human consumption.</i>
<b>intentionality</b>	The quality of mental states (e.g. thoughts, beliefs, desires, hopes) which consists in their being directed towards some object or state of affairs.

<b>logically</b>	In a logical manner. <i>These suggestions are <b>logically</b> impossible.</i>
<b>mistakenly</b>	In a mistaken manner. <i>They <b>mistakenly</b> believed her to be pregnant.</i>
<b>mull</b>	Think about (a fact, proposal, or request) deeply and at length. <i>She began to <b>mull</b> over the various possibilities.</i>
<u><a href="#">muse</a></u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>Yeats <b>muse</b> Maud Gonne.</i>
<b>opine</b>	Express one's opinion openly and without fear or hesitation. <i>The headmistress <b>opined</b> that the outing would make a nice change for Flora.</i>
<u><a href="#">optimistically</a></u>	In a way that shows hope and confidence about the future. <i>The bank <b>optimistically</b> predicts an economic growth rate of 5 percent.</i>
<u><a href="#">ponder</a></u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>She sat <b>pondering</b> over her problem.</i>
<b>ponderable</b>	Capable of being weighed or considered. <i>Something <b>ponderable</b> from the outer world something of which we can say that its weight is so and so.</i>
<b>reckon</b>	Expect to do a particular thing. <i>I <b>reckon</b> to get away by two thirty.</i>
<u><a href="#">reconsider</a></u>	Consider again (a bill) that had been voted upon before, with a view to altering it. <i>Won't you <b>reconsider</b> your decision.</i>
<u><a href="#">reflect</a></u>	Be bright by reflecting or casting light. <i>Sound is <b>reflected</b> well in this auditorium.</i>
<b>regard</b>	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>The court must have <b>regard</b> to the principle of welfare.</i>
<u><a href="#">reminisce</a></u>	Indulge in enjoyable recollection of past events. <i>They <b>reminisced</b> about their summers abroad.</i>
<u><a href="#">ruminate</a></u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>Goats <b>ruminated</b> nonchalantly around them.</i>
<u><a href="#">speculate</a></u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>Philosophers have <b>speculated</b> on the question of God for thousands of years.</i>
<b>think</b>	An act of thinking. <i>I need to give it a good <b>think</b>.</i>
