

increase Make bigger or more.

The university **increase**d the number of students it admitted.

intensify

Become more intense.

The dispute began to **intensify**.

make deeper Earn on some commercial or business transaction; earn as salary or wages.

Pick or gather mushrooms.

mushroom

These are high performance bullets which mushroom upon impact.

scoop out Get the better of.scrape out Scratch repeatedly.

snowball Throw snowballs at.

The campaign was **snowball**ing.

strengthen Gain strength.

He advises an application of fluoride to **strengthen** the teeth.
