
#### Deepens as a Verb

Make (something) higher. heighten The tension **heighten**ed.

Become or make more intense. **intensify** 

The dispute began to intensify.

- His dislike for raw fish only deepened in Japan.
- This event only deepened my convictions.

escalate Make or become more intense or serious.

The disturbance **escalate**d into a full scale riot.

**exacerbate** The strong pound has **exacerbate**d the situation by making it much

harder for UK companies to compete on price.

Add nutrients to.

The girl was fortified by her religious faith.

harden Cause to accept or become hardened to habituate.

The cold **harden**ed the butter.

heighten Make more intense, stronger, or more marked.

The stage will be extended **heighten**ing the grid by 3.4 metres.

The amount by which something increases.

They proposed an **increase** of 15 percent in the fare.

intensification Action that makes something stronger or more extreme.

**cion** The **intensification** of the conflict.

intensify Become more intense.

The dispute began to **intensify**.

**intension** Resolution or determination.

intensity High level or degree; the property of being intense.

He adjusted the **intensity** of the sound.

ossify Turn into bone or bony tissue.

These tracheal cartilages may **ossify**.

Strengthen and support with rewards.

reinforce

reinforcement Information that makes more forcible or convincing.
