cumbersome	Large or heavy and therefore difficult to carry or use; unwieldy. <i>A cumbersome piece of machinery.</i>
dent	Mark with a dent. <i>The bicycle dented my car.</i>
depth	The intellectual ability to penetrate deeply into ideas. <i>The depth of his sighs.</i>
disservice	An act intended to help that turns out badly. <i>You have done a disservice to the African people by ignoring this fact.</i>
engrave	Cut or carve a text or design on (a hard object). <i>The crystal glasses were engraved with the Queen s cipher.</i>
furrow	Cut a furrow into a columns. <i>The tractors continuously furrowed the fields for several days.</i>
gouge	The act of gouging. <i>One of the young man s eyes had been gouged out.</i>
groove	Make a groove in or provide with a groove. <i>Deep lines grooved her face.</i>

height	A high place or position. <i>He was of medium height.</i>
immense	Extremely large or great, especially in scale or degree. <i>A factor of immense importance.</i>
incredible	Difficult to believe; extraordinary. <i>I was mesmerized she looked so incredible.</i>
ingrained	Deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held. <i>The ingrained dirt on the flaking paintwork.</i>
large	A garment size for a large person. <i>A large number of newspapers.</i>
massive	Imposing in scale or scope or degree or power. <i>Massive sulphides.</i>
oversized	Bigger than the usual size. <i>An oversized T shirt.</i>
personage	Another word for person; a person not meriting identification. <i>The key explains who all the personages in the paintings are.</i>
pit	Drive a racing car into the pits for fuel or maintenance. <i>You ll get the chance to pit your wits against the world champions.</i>
profoundly	In a profound way; greatly. <i>He profoundly altered the whole course of my life.</i>
profundity	Wisdom that is recondite and abstruse and profound. <i>The simplicity and profundity of the message.</i>
significant	Having a particular meaning; indicative of something. <i>A significant change in the Constitution.</i>
sized	Having a specified size. <i>Comfortably sized rooms.</i>
slumber	A natural and periodic state of rest during which consciousness of the world is suspended. <i>The village street slumbered under the afternoon sun.</i>
undercurrent	An underlying feeling or influence, especially one that is contrary to the prevailing atmosphere and is not expressed openly. <i>Racial undercurrents.</i>
undertone	A quiet or hushed tone of voice. <i>They were talking in undertones.</i>
voluminous	(of a piece of furniture) large and accommodating. <i>A subject of voluminous legislation.</i>
