
### Deface as a Verb

**disfigure** Spoil the appearance of.

**Ingure** The vandals **disfigure**d the statue.

mar Destroy or injure severely.

Violence **mar**red a number of New Year celebrations.

**ruin** Reduce to ruins.

They were **ruin**ed by the highest interest rates this century.

Hinder or prevent (the efforts, plans, or desires) of.

spoil

She was afraid of spoiling Christmas for the rest of the family.

sully Charge falsely or with malicious intent.

They were outraged that anyone should **sully** their good name.

Make dirty or spotty, as by exposure to air; also used metaphorically.

Silver tarnishes too easily.

vandalize Destroy wantonly, as through acts of vandalism.


Stations have been vandalized beyond recognition.

**deformed** So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly.

vitiate Destroy or impair the legal validity of.

The insurance is **vitiate**d because of foolish acts on the part of the tenant.

wound Inflict a wound on.

Mound A knife wound.
