Defensive as an Adjective

Definitions of "Defensive" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "defensive" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Used or intended to defend or protect.
- Very anxious to challenge or avoid criticism.
- Intended or appropriate for defending against or deterring aggression or attack.
- (in sport) relating to or intended as defence.
- Attempting to justify or defend in speech or writing.





Synonyms of "Defensive" as an adjective (10 Words)

(in sport) protecting one's goal or wicket rather than attempting to score

defending against one's opponents.

The **defending** champion.

justificative Providing justification.

Serving as proof or justification. **justificatory**

Justificatory arguments.

(in non-technical use) abnormally sensitive, obsessive, or anxious. neurotic

He seemed a **neurotic** self obsessed character.

(especially of a person or an instrument) excessively sensitive. *Bentley was oversensitive to criticism.* oversensitive

Suffering from paranoia. paranoid You think I m **paranoid** but I tell you there is something going on.

Very irritable. prickly

She came across as **prickly** and generally difficult.



protecting Shielding (or designed to shield) against harm or discomfort.

The **protecting** blanket of snow.

Showing care.

A **protective** covering.

thin-skinned Quick to take offense.

- A defensive stance.
- He was very defensive about that side of his life.
- Defensive barriers.
- A defensive player.
- Defensive weapons.

weaponry used by military or naval force.

Instruments of disarmament rather than of armament.

arms Weapons; armaments.

Arms and ammunition.

battlefield A region where a battle is being (or has been) fought.

The **battlefield**s of the Great War.

blockade Impose a blockade on.

The authorities **blockade**d roads in and out of the capital.

The action of overcoming a problem or difficulty, typically in a clever and

circumvention surreptitious way.

Circumvention of the rules undermines any fairness.

fortification The action of fortifying or process of being fortified.

A medieval **fortification**.



Shoot with a gun.

A grease **gun**.

intercept An act or instance of intercepting something. I **intercept**ed Edward on his way to work.

machiavellian A follower of Machiavelli's principles.

Maneuver A deliberate coordinated movement requiring dexterity and skill.

He **maneuver**ed to get the chairmanship.

military The military forces of a nation.

The build up of military activity.

moat Surround a place with a moat.

munition Military weapons ammunition equipment and stores.

Munition factories.

naval Connected with or belonging to or used in a navy.

A **naval** base.

obstructionist Someone who systematically obstructs some action that others want to

take.

ordnance Large but transportable armament.

The **ordnance** corps.

A maneuver in a game or conversation.

ploy The eternal cross stitch I was set to do before I could indulge my own

ploys.

prevent (of God) go before (someone) with spiritual guidance and help.

Locks won t **prevent** a determined burglar from getting in.

(usually followed by `of') solicitously caring or mindful.

Animals with **protective** coloring.

A group of herons.

Two cult members have died so far in the four day **siege**.

stratagem A maneuver in a game or conversation.

A series of devious **stratagem**s.

In a way that relates to the achievement of long-term or overall aims and

strategically interests.

We have to think **strategically** about how best to utilize our facilities.

Make determined efforts to deal with (a problem or difficult task.

The first scoring chance came when Orrell **tackle**d Webb.

The art of disposing armed forces in order of battle and of organizing

tactic operations, especially during contact with an enemy.

The minority attempted to control the Council by a delaying **tactic**.



tactics A plan for attaining a particular goal.

A small tower on top of a larger tower or at the corner of a building or

turret wall, typically of a castle.

A castle with fairy tale **turret**s.

unbeatable Extremely good; outstanding. *The team is* **unbeatable**.

wall

Anything that suggests a wall in structure or function or effect.

He curled a free kick around the wall for a late equalizer.

warfare The waging of armed conflict against an enemy.

Diplomatic warfare.

An act of using a listening device to conduct surveillance, typically over a

phone line.

wiretap

After putting a wiretap on the phone of the pizzeria agents searched
