- dense** Permitting little if any light to pass through because of denseness of matter.
A dark dense novel.

firewood	Wood used for fuel. <i>They collected and cut their own firewood.</i>
forest	Denoting an area that was formerly a royal forest. <i>Afforest the mountains.</i>
glade	An open space in a wood or forest. <i>Glades of birch.</i>
greenery	Green foliage.
hew	Make or shape as with an axe. <i>Hew an oak.</i>
jungle	A wild tangled mass of vegetation or other things. <i>It s a jungle out there.</i>
lea	An open area of grassy or arable land. <i>The lowing herd winds slowly o er the lea.</i>
logging	The work of cutting down trees for timber. <i>Logging companies.</i>
lumber	Cut lumber as in woods and forests. <i>The heavy man lumbered across the room.</i>
lush	Characterized by extravagance and profusion. <i>These architecture magazines are full of the lush interiors of the rich and famous.</i>
marshland	Land consisting of marshes. <i>Acres of meadows and marshlands.</i>
meadow	A field where grass or alfalfa are grown to be made into hay. <i>A meadow ready for cutting.</i>
pasture	Let feed in a field or pasture or meadow. <i>Areas of rich meadow pasture.</i>
pulpwood	Softwood used to make paper.
rainforest	A luxuriant, dense forest rich in biodiversity, found typically in tropical areas with consistently heavy rainfall. <i>Tracts of rainforest.</i>
rampant	(of a plant) having a lush and unchecked growth. <i>A lion rampant.</i>
swamp	An area of waterlogged ground. <i>He was trapped in a medical swamp.</i>
timber	Wood prepared for use in building and carpentry. <i>The exploitation of forests for timber.</i>

- timberline** Line marking the upper limit of tree growth in mountains or northern latitudes.
- tree** Stretch a shoe on a shoetree.
*Her dog likes to **tree** squirrels.*
- trek** Fish using a trek net.
*I was at the new flat waiting for my **trek** to arrive.*
- tropical** Of or relating to the tropics, or either tropic.
***Tropical** fruit.*
- verdant** Characterized by abundance of verdure.
*A deep **verdant** green.*
- wetland** A low area where the land is saturated with water.
***Wetland** habitats.*
- woodland** Land that is covered with trees and shrubs.
*Large areas of ancient **woodland**.*
