- defoliate** Remove leaves from (a tree, plant, or area of land), for agricultural purposes or as a military tactic.  
*A defoliated poplar.*
- deforest** Clear (an area) of forests or trees.  
*404 000 sq km had been deforested.*
- dense** Permitting little if any light to pass through because of denseness of matter.  
*A dark dense novel.*

<b>firewood</b>	Wood used for fuel. <i>They collected and cut their own <b>firewood</b>.</i>
<b>forest</b>	Denoting an area that was formerly a royal forest. <i>A<b>fforest</b> the mountains.</i>
<b>glade</b>	An open space in a wood or forest. <i><b>Glades</b> of birch.</i>
<b>greenery</b>	Green foliage.
<b>hew</b>	Make or shape as with an axe. <i><b>Hew</b> an oak.</i>
<b>jungle</b>	A wild tangled mass of vegetation or other things. <i>It s a <b>jungle</b> out there.</i>
<b>lea</b>	An open area of grassy or arable land. <i>The lowing herd winds slowly o er the <b>lea</b>.</i>
<b>logging</b>	The work of cutting down trees for timber. <i><b>Logging</b> companies.</i>
<b>lumber</b>	Cut lumber as in woods and forests. <i>The heavy man <b>lumbered</b> across the room.</i>
<b>lush</b>	Characterized by extravagance and profusion. <i>These architecture magazines are full of the <b>lush</b> interiors of the rich and famous.</i>
<b>marshland</b>	Land consisting of marshes. <i>Acres of meadows and <b>marshlands</b>.</i>
<b>meadow</b>	A field where grass or alfalfa are grown to be made into hay. <i>A <b>meadow</b> ready for cutting.</i>
<b>pasture</b>	Let feed in a field or pasture or meadow. <i>Areas of rich meadow <b>pasture</b>.</i>
<b>pulpwood</b>	Softwood used to make paper.
<b>rainforest</b>	A luxuriant, dense forest rich in biodiversity, found typically in tropical areas with consistently heavy rainfall. <i>Tracts of <b>rainforest</b>.</i>
<b>rampant</b>	(of a plant) having a lush and unchecked growth. <i>A lion <b>rampant</b>.</i>
<b>swamp</b>	An area of waterlogged ground. <i>He was trapped in a medical <b>swamp</b>.</i>
<b>timber</b>	Wood prepared for use in building and carpentry. <i>The exploitation of forests for <b>timber</b>.</i>

- timberline** Line marking the upper limit of tree growth in mountains or northern latitudes.
- tree** Stretch a shoe on a shoetree.  
*Her dog likes to **tree** squirrels.*
- trek** Fish using a trek net.  
*I was at the new flat waiting for my **trek** to arrive.*
- tropical** Of or relating to the tropics, or either tropic.  
***Tropical** fruit.*
- verdant** Characterized by abundance of verdure.  
*A deep **verdant** green.*
- wetland** A low area where the land is saturated with water.  
***Wetland** habitats.*
- woodland** Land that is covered with trees and shrubs.  
*Large areas of ancient **woodland**.*
