irreversibly In an irreversible manner.

Our landscape will be **irreversibly** damaged.

Injure or wound seriously and leave permanent disfiguration or mutilation.

100 000 soldiers were killed or **maim**ed.

manipulate

Manipulate in a fraudulent manner.

Nations may still be able to **manipulate** their own data.

A mark or flaw that spoils the appearance of something especially on a

mar person s body.

Nothing **mar**red her beauty.

mutant A mutant form.

A mutant gene.

(with reference to a cell, DNA molecule, etc.) undergo or cause to undergo

mutate change in a gene or genes.

The virus is able to **mutate** into new forms that are immune to the vaccine.

plastically In a plastic manner.

spoil The act of spoiling something by causing damage to it.

transformed Given a completely different form or appearance.

Shocked to see the **transformed** landscape.

wrest A key for tuning a harp or piano.
