Deformed as an Adjective

Definitions of "Deformed" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “deformed” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a person or part of the body) not having the normal or natural shape or form; misshapen.*
- *So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly.*



Synonyms of "Deformed" as an adjective (4 Words)

- distorted** Giving a misleading or false account or impression; misrepresented.
*His report gives a **distorted** view of the meeting.*
- ill-shapen** So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly.
- malformed** So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly.
*A limp caused by a **malformed** foot.*
- misshapen** So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly.
***Misshapen** fruit.*



Usage Examples of "Deformed" as an adjective

- *His deformed hands.*
- *Deformed thalidomide babies.*

atrocious

Provoking horror- Winston Churchill.

Atrocious weather.

changed

Changed in constitution or structure or composition by metamorphism.

Changed attitudes.

contort

Twist and press out of shape.

A spasm of pain **contorted** his face.

crimp

A small connecting piece for crimping wires or lines together.

The **crimp** on take home pay has been even tighter since taxes were raised.

damaged

Being unjustly brought into disrepute.

The storm left a wake of badly **damaged** buildings.

deform

Become distorted or misshapen undergo deformation.

The heat **deformed** the plastic sculpture.

| deformity | An appearance that has been spoiled or is misshapen. <i>Respiratory problems caused by spinal deformity.</i> |
| disfigure | Spoil the appearance of. <i>The vandals disfigured the statue.</i> |
| <u>disingenuous</u> | Not straightforward or candid; giving a false appearance of frankness- David Cannadine. <i>A disingenuous excuse.</i> |
| <u>distorted</u> | So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly. <i>His report gives a distorted view of the meeting.</i> |
| exaggerated | Represented as greater than is true or reasonable. <i>Comic book characters are drawn with exaggerated features so you will remember them.</i> |
| garble | A garbled account or transmission. <i>Most readers assumed the word was a typographical garble.</i> |
| hideous | Extremely ugly. <i>A hideous scar.</i> |
| irreparable | Impossible to repair, rectify, or amend. <i>They were doing irreparable damage to my heart and lungs.</i> |
| irreversibly | In an irreversible manner. <i>Our landscape will be irreversibly damaged.</i> |
| maim | Injure or wound seriously and leave permanent disfiguration or mutilation. <i>100 000 soldiers were killed or maimed.</i> |
| <u>manipulate</u> | Manipulate in a fraudulent manner. <i>Nations may still be able to manipulate their own data.</i> |
| mar | A mark or flaw that spoils the appearance of something especially on a person's body. <i>Nothing marred her beauty.</i> |
| <u>mutant</u> | A mutant form. <i>A mutant gene.</i> |
| mutate | (with reference to a cell, DNA molecule, etc.) undergo or cause to undergo change in a gene or genes. <i>The virus is able to mutate into new forms that are immune to the vaccine.</i> |
| plastically | In a plastic manner. |
| spoil | The act of spoiling something by causing damage to it. <i>I wouldn't want to spoil your fun.</i> |
| transformed | Given a completely different form or appearance. <i>Shocked to see the transformed landscape.</i> |

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| turn | Cause to change or turn into something different assume new characteristics. <i>The water turned into ice.</i> |
| <u>twisted</u> | (of a personality or a way of thinking) unpleasantly or unhealthily abnormal; warped. <i>Many of the facts seemed twisted out of any semblance to reality.</i> |
| unlovely | Without beauty or charm. <i>Unlovely tower blocks.</i> |
| unsightly | Unpleasant to look at; ugly. <i>An unsightly rubbish tip.</i> |
| warped | Used especially of timbers or boards; bent out of shape usually by moisture. <i>Warped wooden planks.</i> |
| wrench | Turn something especially a nut or bolt with a wrench. <i>Wrench oneself free from somebody's grip.</i> |
| wrest | A key for tuning a harp or piano. <i>You appear convinced of my guilt and wrest every reply I have made.</i> |
