### **Definitions of "Deformed" as an adjective**

- *So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly.*

- distorted** Giving a misleading or false account or impression; misrepresented.  
*His report gives a **distorted** view of the meeting.*
- ill-shapen** So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly.
- malformed** So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly.  
*A limp caused by a **malformed** foot.*
- misshapen** So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly.  
***Misshapen** fruit.*

<b>atrocious</b>	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. <i><b>Atrocious</b> weather.</i>
<b>changed</b>	Changed in constitution or structure or composition by metamorphism. <i><b>Changed</b> attitudes.</i>
<b>contort</b>	Twist and press out of shape. <i>A spasm of pain <b>contorted</b> his face.</i>
<b>crimp</b>	A small connecting piece for crimping wires or lines together. <i>The <b>crimp</b> on take home pay has been even tighter since taxes were raised.</i>
<b>damaged</b>	Being unjustly brought into disrepute. <i>The storm left a wake of badly <b>damaged</b> buildings.</i>
<b>deform</b>	Become distorted or misshapen undergo deformation. <i>The heat <b>deformed</b> the plastic sculpture.</i>

<b>deformity</b>	An appearance that has been spoiled or is misshapen. <i>Respiratory problems caused by spinal <b>deformity</b>.</i>
<b>disfigure</b>	Spoil the appearance of. <i>The vandals <b>disfigured</b> the statue.</i>
<b><u>disingenuous</u></b>	Not straightforward or candid; giving a false appearance of frankness- David Cannadine. <i>A <b>disingenuous</b> excuse.</i>
<b><u>distorted</u></b>	So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly. <i>His report gives a <b>distorted</b> view of the meeting.</i>
<b>exaggerated</b>	Represented as greater than is true or reasonable. <i>Comic book characters are drawn with <b>exaggerated</b> features so you will remember them.</i>
<b>garble</b>	A garbled account or transmission. <i>Most readers assumed the word was a typographical <b>garble</b>.</i>
<b>hideous</b>	Extremely ugly. <i>A <b>hideous</b> scar.</i>
<b>irreparable</b>	Impossible to repair, rectify, or amend. <i>They were doing <b>irreparable</b> damage to my heart and lungs.</i>
<b>irreversibly</b>	In an irreversible manner. <i>Our landscape will be <b>irreversibly</b> damaged.</i>
<b>maim</b>	Injure or wound seriously and leave permanent disfiguration or mutilation. <i>100 000 soldiers were killed or <b>maimed</b>.</i>
<b><u>manipulate</u></b>	Manipulate in a fraudulent manner. <i>Nations may still be able to <b>manipulate</b> their own data.</i>
<b>mar</b>	A mark or flaw that spoils the appearance of something especially on a person's body. <i>Nothing <b>marred</b> her beauty.</i>
<b><u>mutant</u></b>	A mutant form. <i>A <b>mutant</b> gene.</i>
<b>mutate</b>	(with reference to a cell, DNA molecule, etc.) undergo or cause to undergo change in a gene or genes. <i>The virus is able to <b>mutate</b> into new forms that are immune to the vaccine.</i>
<b>plastically</b>	In a plastic manner.
<b>spoil</b>	The act of spoiling something by causing damage to it. <i>I wouldn't want to <b>spoil</b> your fun.</i>
<b>transformed</b>	Given a completely different form or appearance. <i>Shocked to see the <b>transformed</b> landscape.</i>

<b>turn</b>	Cause to change or turn into something different assume new characteristics. <i>The water <b>turned</b> into ice.</i>
<b>twisted</b>	(of a personality or a way of thinking) unpleasantly or unhealthily abnormal; warped. <i>Many of the facts seemed <b>twisted</b> out of any semblance to reality.</i>
<b>unlovely</b>	Without beauty or charm. <i><b>Unlovely</b> tower blocks.</i>
<b>unsightly</b>	Unpleasant to look at; ugly. <i>An <b>unsightly</b> rubbish tip.</i>
<b>warped</b>	Used especially of timbers or boards; bent out of shape usually by moisture. <i><b>Warped</b> wooden planks.</i>
<b>wrench</b>	Turn something especially a nut or bolt with a wrench. <i><b>Wrench</b> oneself free from somebody s grip.</i>
<b>wrest</b>	A key for tuning a harp or piano. <i>You appear convinced of my guilt and <b>wrest</b> every reply I have made.</i>
