appealing

Evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings.
*Village life is somehow more **appealing**.*

appetizing

Stimulating one's appetite.
*The **appetizing** aroma of sizzling bacon.*

beguiling

Charming or enchanting, often in a deceptive way.
*A **beguiling** mixture of English French and Italian.*

captivating

Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming.
*Roosevelt was a **captivating** speaker.*

Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare.
*A **charming** little cottage.*

Greatly pleasing or entertaining.

Causing delight; charming.

engaging	Charming and attractive. <i>An engaging smile.</i>
flavourful	(of food or drink) having a full, distinctive taste; full of flavour. <i>A higher temperature results in a darker more flavourful beer.</i>
flavoursome	Full of flavor. <i>An incredibly rich and flavoursome dish.</i>
<u>inviting</u>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An inviting offer.</i>
lovely	Appealing to the emotions as well as the eye. <i>How lovely to see you.</i>
<u>luscious</u>	Having strong sexual appeal. <i>He ll fall for a luscious Spanish girl who can match him in passion.</i>
mouth-watering	Pleasing to the sense of taste.
pleasant-tasting	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste.
<u>scrumptious</u>	(of a person) very attractive. <i>He is simply the most scrumptious thing on two legs.</i>
sexually attractive	Having the properties of a magnet; the ability to draw or pull.
toothsome	(of food) temptingly tasty. <i>A toothsome bimbo.</i>
very enjoyable	Being the exact same one; not any other.
very palatable	Precisely as stated.
winning	Attractive; endearing. <i>The winning team.</i>
<u>yummy</u>	(of food) delicious. <i>Yummy cream cakes.</i>

appetizing	Appealing to or stimulating the appetite especially in appearance or aroma. <i>The appetizing aroma of sizzling bacon.</i>
comestible	An item of food. <i>A fridge groaning with comestibles.</i>
delicatessen	Ready-to-eat food products.
delicious	Delightful. <i>A delicious joke.</i>
eatable	Fit to be consumed as food. <i>Parcels of eatables and gifts.</i>
flavor	Lend flavor to.
flavorful	Full of flavor.
flavour	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>The extracts give a flavour of the content and tone of the conversation.</i>
fragrant	Pleasant-smelling. <i>She gathered the fragrant blooms.</i>
gastronomy	A particular style of cookery (as of a region). <i>Traditional American gastronomy.</i>
insipid	Lacking vigour or interest. <i>Many artists continued to churn out insipid shallow works.</i>
luscious	Very sexually attractive. <i>The luscious brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.</i>
nip	Sever or remove by pinching or snipping. <i>The vegetable garden nipped now by frost.</i>
palatable	(of an action or proposal) acceptable or satisfactory. <i>A very palatable local red wine.</i>
piquancy	The quality of being pleasantly stimulating or exciting; interest. <i>The tangy soy dip gave them a slightly Asian piquancy.</i>

preference	A prior right or precedence, especially in connection with the payment of debts. <i>Her preference for white wine.</i>
repast	The food served and eaten at one time. <i>A sumptuous repast.</i>
savor	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
savory	Pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>A past that was scarcely savory.</i>
savour	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>Gourmets will want to savour our game specialities.</i>
sour	Go sour or spoil. <i>A sour temper.</i>
spicy	Having an agreeably pungent taste. <i>Spicy jokes and suggestive songs.</i>
sweet	With sweetening added. <i>A cup of hot sweet tea.</i>
tang	Any of various kelps especially of the genus Laminaria. <i>A full tang is used for strength.</i>
taste	Perceive by the sense of taste. <i>It was his first taste of serious action.</i>
tasty	Pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>Some tasty piano licks.</i>
zesty	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
