<b>delicious</b>	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i>A <b>delicious</b> joke.</i>
<b><u>delightful</u></b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A <b>delightful</b> surprise.</i>

<b><u>enchanting</u></b>	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i><b>Enchanting</b> music.</i>
<b>engaging</b>	Charming and attractive. <i>An <b>engaging</b> smile.</i>
<b>flavourful</b>	(of food or drink) having a full, distinctive taste; full of flavour. <i>A higher temperature results in a darker more <b>flavourful</b> beer.</i>
<b>flavoursome</b>	Full of flavor. <i>An incredibly rich and <b>flavoursome</b> dish.</i>
<b><u>inviting</u></b>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An <b>inviting</b> offer.</i>
<b>lovely</b>	Appealing to the emotions as well as the eye. <i>How <b>lovely</b> to see you.</i>
<b><u>luscious</u></b>	Having strong sexual appeal. <i>He ll fall for a <b>luscious</b> Spanish girl who can match him in passion.</i>
<b>mouth-watering</b>	Pleasing to the sense of taste.
<b>pleasant-tasting</b>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste.
<b><u>scrumptious</u></b>	(of a person) very attractive. <i>He is simply the most <b>scrumptious</b> thing on two legs.</i>
<b>sexually attractive</b>	Having the properties of a magnet; the ability to draw or pull.
<b>toothsome</b>	(of food) temptingly tasty. <i>A <b>toothsome</b> bimbo.</i>
<b>very enjoyable</b>	Being the exact same one; not any other.
<b>very palatable</b>	Precisely as stated.
<b>winning</b>	Attractive; endearing. <i>The <b>winning</b> team.</i>
<b><u>yummy</u></b>	(of food) delicious. <i><b>Yummy</b> cream cakes.</i>

<b>acidic</b>	(of rock, especially lava) relatively rich in silica. <i><b>Acidic</b> granite batholiths.</i>
<b>acidulous</b>	Sharp-tasting; sour.
<b>ambrosial</b>	Worthy of the gods. <i><b>Ambrosial</b> food.</i>
<b>appetizing</b>	Appealing to or stimulating the appetite especially in appearance or aroma. <i>The <b>appetizing</b> aroma of sizzling bacon.</i>
<b>comestible</b>	An item of food. <i>A fridge groaning with <b>comestibles</b>.</i>
<b>delicatessen</b>	Ready-to-eat food products.
<b>delicious</b>	Delightful. <i>A <b>delicious</b> joke.</i>

<b>flavor</b>	Lend flavor to.
<b>flavorful</b>	Full of flavor.
<b>flavour</b>	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>The extracts give a <b>flavour</b> of the content and tone of the conversation.</i>
<b>fragrant</b>	Pleasant-smelling. <i>She gathered the <b>fragrant</b> blooms.</i>
<b>gastronomy</b>	A particular style of cookery (as of a region). <i>Traditional American <b>gastronomy</b>.</i>
<b>insipid</b>	Lacking vigour or interest. <i>Many artists continued to churn out <b>insipid</b> shallow works.</i>
<b>luscious</b>	Very sexually attractive. <i>The <b>luscious</b> brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.</i>
<b>nip</b>	Sever or remove by pinching or snipping. <i>The vegetable garden <b>nipped</b> now by frost.</i>
<b>palatable</b>	(of an action or proposal) acceptable or satisfactory. <i>A very <b>palatable</b> local red wine.</i>
<b>piquancy</b>	The quality of being pleasantly stimulating or exciting; interest. <i>The tangy soy dip gave them a slightly Asian <b>piquancy</b>.</i>

<b>preference</b>	A prior right or precedence, especially in connection with the payment of debts. <i>Her <b>preference</b> for white wine.</i>
<b>repast</b>	The food served and eaten at one time. <i>A sumptuous <b>repast</b>.</i>
<b>savor</b>	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i><b>Savor</b> the soup.</i>
<b>savory</b>	Pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>A past that was scarcely <b>savory</b>.</i>
<b>savour</b>	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>Gourmets will want to <b>savour</b> our game specialities.</i>
<b>sour</b>	Go sour or spoil. <i>A <b>sour</b> temper.</i>
<b>spicy</b>	Having an agreeably pungent taste. <i><b>Spicy</b> jokes and suggestive songs.</i>
<b>sweet</b>	With sweetening added. <i>A cup of hot <b>sweet</b> tea.</i>
<b>tang</b>	Any of various kelps especially of the genus Laminaria. <i>A full <b>tang</b> is used for strength.</i>
<b>taste</b>	Perceive by the sense of taste. <i>It was his first <b>taste</b> of serious action.</i>
<b>tasty</b>	Pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>Some <b>tasty</b> piano licks.</i>
<b>zesty</b>	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
