## Associations of "Delegated" (30 Words)

<b>allow</b>	Allow or plan for a certain possibility concede the truth or validity of something. <i>The river was patrolled and few people were <b>allowed</b> across.</i>
<b><u>appellation</u></b>	A geographical indication used to identify where the grapes for a wine are grown. <i>The city fully justifies its <b>appellation</b> the Pearl of the Orient.</i>
<b>appoint</b>	Determine or decide on (a time or a place). <i>They <b>appointed</b> her as personnel manager.</i>
<b>assign</b>	Give an assignment to a person to a post or assign a task to a person. <i>She has been <b>assigned</b> to a new job.</i>
<b>assignment</b>	The allocation of someone or something as belonging to a particular group or category. <i>The <b>assignment</b> of individuals to particular social positions.</i>
<b>authorize</b>	Grant authorization or clearance for. <i>She <b>authorized</b> her assistant to sign the papers.</i>
<b>candidate</b>	A person or thing regarded as suitable for or likely to receive a particular fate, treatment, or position. <i>The Green Party <b>candidate</b>.</i>
<b>caucus</b>	Hold or form a legislative caucus. <i>There is one Independent who <b>caucuses</b> with the Democrats.</i>
<b>colonel</b>	A commissioned military officer in the United States Army or Air Force or Marines who ranks above a lieutenant colonel and below a brigadier general.
<b>commissioned</b>	(especially of a work of art) produced specially to order. <i>Those interested in pursuing careers as <b>commissioned</b> officers.</i>
<b>commissioner</b>	A person appointed to regulate a particular sport. <i>A baseball <b>commissioner</b>.</i>

<b>delegation</b>	A body of delegates or representatives; a deputation. <i>The <b>delegation</b> of power to the district councils.</i>
<b>denominate</b>	(of sums of money) be expressed in a specified monetary unit. <i>The borrowings were <b>denominated</b> in US dollars.</i>
<b>deputation</b>	A group of representatives or delegates. <i>He had been a member of a <b>deputation</b> to Napoleon III.</i>
<b>deputy</b>	A person appointed to represent or act on behalf of others. <i>His <b>deputy</b> has been largely running the business for the past year.</i>
<u><a href="#">designate</a></u>	Decree or designate beforehand. <i>Certain schools are <b>designated</b> science schools.</i>
<u><a href="#">designation</a></u>	The action of choosing a place for a special purpose or giving it a special status. <i>Dibden Bay's <b>designation</b> as a Site of Special Scientific Interest.</i>
<u><a href="#">empower</a></u>	Give or delegate power or authority to. <i>Members are <b>empowered</b> to audit the accounts of limited companies.</i>
<b>excellency</b>	An outstanding feature or quality. <i>The characteristic excellencies of Wordsworth's poetry are listed.</i>
<b>glyph</b>	A hieroglyphic character or symbol. <i>These <b>glyphs</b> refer to an ancient Olmec ruler.</i>
<b>leader</b>	A shoot of a plant at the apex of a stem or main branch. <i>A <b>leader</b> in the use of video conferencing.</i>
<b>mayor</b>	(in the US, Canada, and certain other countries) the head of a municipal corporation, elected by the public.
<u><a href="#">name</a></u>	Give a name to. <i>She was <b>named</b> Head of the Committee.</i>
<b>nominate</b>	Put forward nominate for appointment to an office or for an honor or position. <i>The President <b>nominated</b> her as head of the Civil Rights Commission.</i>
<b>ordained</b>	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>An <b>ordained</b> priest.</i>
<u><a href="#">permit</a></u>	Allow for; admit of. <i>This will <b>permit</b> the rain to run off.</i>
<u><a href="#">president</a></u>	The head of a university. <i>The Irish <b>president</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">qualify</a></u>	Make fit or prepared. <i>She felt obliged to <b>qualify</b> her first short answer.</i>

**representative**

Of a government or political system based on elected or chosen representatives.

*A PLO **representative** attending a meeting in Damascus.*
