Associations of "Delegated" (30 Words)

allow	Allow or plan for a certain possibility concede the truth or validity of something. <i>The river was patrolled and few people were allowed across.</i>
<u>appellation</u>	A geographical indication used to identify where the grapes for a wine are grown. <i>The city fully justifies its appellation the Pearl of the Orient.</i>
appoint	Determine or decide on (a time or a place). <i>They appointed her as personnel manager.</i>
assign	Give an assignment to a person to a post or assign a task to a person. <i>She has been assigned to a new job.</i>
assignment	The allocation of someone or something as belonging to a particular group or category. <i>The assignment of individuals to particular social positions.</i>
authorize	Grant authorization or clearance for. <i>She authorized her assistant to sign the papers.</i>
candidate	A person or thing regarded as suitable for or likely to receive a particular fate, treatment, or position. <i>The Green Party candidate.</i>
caucus	Hold or form a legislative caucus. <i>There is one Independent who caucuses with the Democrats.</i>
colonel	A commissioned military officer in the United States Army or Air Force or Marines who ranks above a lieutenant colonel and below a brigadier general.
commissioned	(especially of a work of art) produced specially to order. <i>Those interested in pursuing careers as commissioned officers.</i>
commissioner	A person appointed to regulate a particular sport. <i>A baseball commissioner.</i>

delegation	A body of delegates or representatives; a deputation. <i>The delegation of power to the district councils.</i>
denominate	(of sums of money) be expressed in a specified monetary unit. <i>The borrowings were denominated in US dollars.</i>
deputation	A group of representatives or delegates. <i>He had been a member of a deputation to Napoleon III.</i>
deputy	A person appointed to represent or act on behalf of others. <i>His deputy has been largely running the business for the past year.</i>
<u>designate</u>	Decree or designate beforehand. <i>Certain schools are designated science schools.</i>
<u>designation</u>	The action of choosing a place for a special purpose or giving it a special status. <i>Dibden Bay's designation as a Site of Special Scientific Interest.</i>
<u>empower</u>	Give or delegate power or authority to. <i>Members are empowered to audit the accounts of limited companies.</i>
excellency	An outstanding feature or quality. <i>The characteristic excellencies of Wordsworth's poetry are listed.</i>
glyph	A hieroglyphic character or symbol. <i>These glyphs refer to an ancient Olmec ruler.</i>
leader	A shoot of a plant at the apex of a stem or main branch. <i>A leader in the use of video conferencing.</i>
mayor	(in the US, Canada, and certain other countries) the head of a municipal corporation, elected by the public.
<u>name</u>	Give a name to. <i>She was named Head of the Committee.</i>
nominate	Put forward nominate for appointment to an office or for an honor or position. <i>The President nominated her as head of the Civil Rights Commission.</i>
ordained	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>An ordained priest.</i>
<u>permit</u>	Allow for; admit of. <i>This will permit the rain to run off.</i>
<u>president</u>	The head of a university. <i>The Irish president.</i>
<u>qualify</u>	Make fit or prepared. <i>She felt obliged to qualify her first short answer.</i>

*The painter **represented** his wife as a young girl.*

representative

Of a government or political system based on elected or chosen representatives.

*A PLO **representative** attending a meeting in Damascus.*
