The action of assigning to an inferior rank or position.
- relegation** *The team manager refuses to throw in the towel and admit that **relegation** is inevitable.*

<b>allow</b>	Allow or plan for a certain possibility concede the truth or validity of something. <i>She was <b>allowed</b> a higher profile.</i>
<b>appellation</b>	A name or title. <i>The city fully justifies its <b>appellation</b> the Pearl of the Orient.</i>
<b>appoint</b>	Decide the disposition of (property of which one is not the owner) under powers granted by the owner. <i>A beautifully <b>appointed</b> house.</i>
<b>assign</b>	Give an assignment to a person to a post or assign a task to a person. <i>It is difficult to decide whether to <b>assign</b> the victory to Godwin.</i>
<b>assignment</b>	(law) a transfer of property by deed of conveyance. <i>The first task is the <b>assignment</b> of an address to each datum.</i>
<b>authorize</b>	Give or delegate power or authority to. <i>The rock star never <b>authorized</b> this slanderous biography.</i>
<b>candidate</b>	A politician who is running for public office. <i>The Green Party <b>candidate</b>.</i>
<b>caucus</b>	Hold or form a legislative caucus. <i>Up to fifty <b>caucuses</b> met daily on conference grounds to discuss lobbying strategies.</i>
<b>colonel</b>	A commissioned military officer in the United States Army or Air Force or Marines who ranks above a lieutenant colonel and below a brigadier general.
<b>commissioned</b>	(of an officer in the army, navy, or air force) holding a rank conferred by a commission. <i>She was painting <b>commissioned</b> portraits in her late teens.</i>
<b>commissioner</b>	A government administrator. <i>A baseball <b>commissioner</b>.</i>
<b>delegation</b>	A group of representatives or delegates. <i>The <b>delegation</b> of power to the district councils.</i>
<b>denominate</b>	(of sums of money) be expressed in a specified monetary unit. <i>The borrowings were <b>denominated</b> in US dollars.</i>
<b>deputation</b>	A group of representatives or delegates. <i>He had been a member of a <b>deputation</b> to Napoleon III.</i>
<b>deputy</b>	A person appointed to represent or act on behalf of others. <i>His <b>deputy</b> has been largely running the business for the past year.</i>

<b><u>designate</u></b>	Decree or designate beforehand. <i>Certain schools are <b>designated</b> science schools.</i>
<b><u>designation</u></b>	The action of choosing a place for a special purpose or giving it a special status. <i>A leader s <b>designation</b> of his own successor.</i>
<b><u>empower</u></b>	Make (someone) stronger and more confident, especially in controlling their life and claiming their rights. <i>Movements to <b>empower</b> the poor.</i>
<b>excellency</b>	An outstanding feature; something in which something or someone excels. <i>His <b>Excellency</b> the Indian Consul General.</i>
<b>glyph</b>	A hieroglyphic character or symbol. <i>Flanges painted with esoteric <b>glyphs</b>.</i>
<b>leader</b>	The person or team that is winning a sporting competition at a particular time. <i>Nora was up among the <b>leaders</b>.</i>
<b>mayor</b>	The head of a city government.
<b><u>name</u></b>	Give a name to. <i>Specialized <b>name</b> brands geared to niche markets.</i>
<b>nominate</b>	Put forward nominate for appointment to an office or for an honor or position. <i>A day was <b>nominated</b> for the exchange of contracts.</i>
<b>ordained</b>	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>An <b>ordained</b> priest.</i>
<b><u>permit</u></b>	Officially allow (someone) to do something. <i>He would not <b>permit</b> anybody access to the library.</i>
<b><u>president</u></b>	The head administrative officer of a college or university. <i>The Irish <b>president</b>.</i>
<b><u>qualify</u></b>	Make (someone) competent or knowledgeable enough to do something. <i><b>Qualify</b> these remarks.</i>
<b>represent</b>	Be representative or typical for. <i>Santos are small wooden figures <b>representing</b> saints.</i>
<b>representative</b>	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. <i>The new government lacked a <b>representative</b> assembly.</i>
