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## Associations of "Deliberating" (30 Words)

<b>brood</b>	(of an animal) kept to be used for breeding. <i>Birds <b>brood</b>.</i>
<b>calculated</b>	(of an action) done with full awareness of the likely consequences. <i>A <b>calculated</b> insult.</i>
<b>cautious</b>	People who are fearful and cautious. <i>The plan received a <b>cautious</b> welcome.</i>
<b>cogitate</b>	Use or exercise the mind or one’s power of reason in order to make inferences, decisions, or arrive at a solution or judgments. <i>He stroked his beard and retired to <b>cogitate</b>.</i>
<b>concoct</b>	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>His cronies <b>concocted</b> a simple plan.</i>
<b>consider</b>	Take into consideration for exemplifying purposes. <i>The old man <b>considered</b> his granddaughter thoughtfully.</i>
<b>contemplate</b>	Think deeply and at length. <i>She couldn t even begin to <b>contemplate</b> the future.</i>
<b>counterfeit</b>	Resemble closely. <i>They <b>counterfeited</b> dollar bills.</i>
<b>deliberately</b>	In a careful and unhurried way. <i>She was working <b>deliberately</b>.</i>
<b>designed</b>	Done or made or performed with purpose and intent. <i>The aircraft performed their <b>designed</b> functions well.</i>
<b>falsehood</b>	The state of being untrue. <i>A downright <b>falsehood</b>.</i>
<b>forgery</b>	Criminal falsification by making or altering an instrument with intent to defraud. <i>He was found guilty of <b>forgery</b>.</i>

<b><u>intend</u></b>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>A jigsaw puzzle <b>intended</b> for three year olds.</i>
<b>intended</b>	Planned or meant. <i>The <b>intended</b> victim escaped.</i>
<b><u>intentional</u></b>	Done on purpose; deliberate. <i><b>Intentional</b> wrongdoing and harm.</i>
<b>intentionality</b>	Expressive of intentions.
<b>knowingly</b>	In a way that suggests one has secret knowledge or awareness. <i>Amy looked at me <b>knowingly</b>.</i>
<b><u>manipulation</u></b>	Exerting shrewd or devious influence especially for one's own advantage. <i>His <b>manipulation</b> of his friends was scandalous.</i>
<b>measured</b>	Having a slow, regular rhythm. <i>His <b>measured</b> prose.</i>
<b><u>muse</u></b>	(in Greek and Roman mythology) each of nine goddesses, the daughters of Zeus and Mnemosyne, who preside over the arts and sciences. <i>Yeats <b>muse</b> Maud Gonne.</i>
<b><u>ponder</u></b>	Think about (something) carefully, especially before making a decision or reaching a conclusion. <i>She sat <b>pondering</b> over her problem.</i>
<b>premeditated</b>	(of an action, especially a crime) thought out or planned beforehand. <i><b>Premeditated</b> murder.</i>
<b>purpose</b>	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something firmness of purpose. <i>He is a man of <b>purpose</b>.</i>
<b>purposefully</b>	In a way that shows determination or resolve. <i>We <b>purposefully</b> avoided addressing the problem.</i>
<b>purposely</b>	On purpose; intentionally. <i>She had <b>purposely</b> made it difficult.</i>
<b><u>ruminant</u></b>	(of a ruminant) chew the cud. <i>Cows <b>ruminant</b>.</i>
<b><u>sabotage</u></b>	Deliberately destroy, damage, or obstruct (something), especially for political or military advantage. <i>The Resistance <b>sabotaged</b> railroad operations during the war.</i>
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>Brows drawn together in <b>thoughtful</b> consideration.</i>
<b>willfully</b>	In a willful manner. <i>She had <b>willfully</b> deceived me.</i>
