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Associations of "Deliberating" (30 Words)

brood	(of an animal) kept to be used for breeding. <i>Birds brood.</i>
calculated	(of an action) done with full awareness of the likely consequences. <i>A calculated insult.</i>
cautious	People who are fearful and cautious. <i>The plan received a cautious welcome.</i>
cogitate	Use or exercise the mind or one's power of reason in order to make inferences, decisions, or arrive at a solution or judgments. <i>He stroked his beard and retired to cogitate.</i>
concoct	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>His cronies concocted a simple plan.</i>
consider	Take into consideration for exemplifying purposes. <i>The old man considered his granddaughter thoughtfully.</i>
contemplate	Think deeply and at length. <i>She couldn't even begin to contemplate the future.</i>
counterfeit	Resemble closely. <i>They counterfeited dollar bills.</i>
deliberately	In a careful and unhurried way. <i>She was working deliberately.</i>
designed	Done or made or performed with purpose and intent. <i>The aircraft performed their designed functions well.</i>
falsehood	The state of being untrue. <i>A downright falsehood.</i>
forgery	Criminal falsification by making or altering an instrument with intent to defraud. <i>He was found guilty of forgery.</i>

<u>intend</u>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>A jigsaw puzzle intended for three year olds.</i>
intended	Planned or meant. <i>The intended victim escaped.</i>
<u>intentional</u>	Done on purpose; deliberate. <i>Intentional wrongdoing and harm.</i>
intentionality	Expressive of intentions.
knowingly	In a way that suggests one has secret knowledge or awareness. <i>Amy looked at me knowingly.</i>
<u>manipulation</u>	Exerting shrewd or devious influence especially for one's own advantage. <i>His manipulation of his friends was scandalous.</i>
measured	Having a slow, regular rhythm. <i>His measured prose.</i>
<u>muse</u>	(in Greek and Roman mythology) each of nine goddesses, the daughters of Zeus and Mnemosyne, who preside over the arts and sciences. <i>Yeats muse Maud Gonne.</i>
<u>ponder</u>	Think about (something) carefully, especially before making a decision or reaching a conclusion. <i>She sat pondering over her problem.</i>
premeditated	(of an action, especially a crime) thought out or planned beforehand. <i>Premeditated murder.</i>
purpose	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something firmness of purpose. <i>He is a man of purpose.</i>
purposefully	In a way that shows determination or resolve. <i>We purposefully avoided addressing the problem.</i>
purposely	On purpose; intentionally. <i>She had purposely made it difficult.</i>
<u>ruminate</u>	(of a ruminant) chew the cud. <i>Cows ruminate.</i>
<u>sabotage</u>	Deliberately destroy, damage, or obstruct (something), especially for political or military advantage. <i>The Resistance sabotaged railroad operations during the war.</i>
thoughtful	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>Brows drawn together in thoughtful consideration.</i>
willfully	In a willful manner. <i>She had willfully deceived me.</i>
