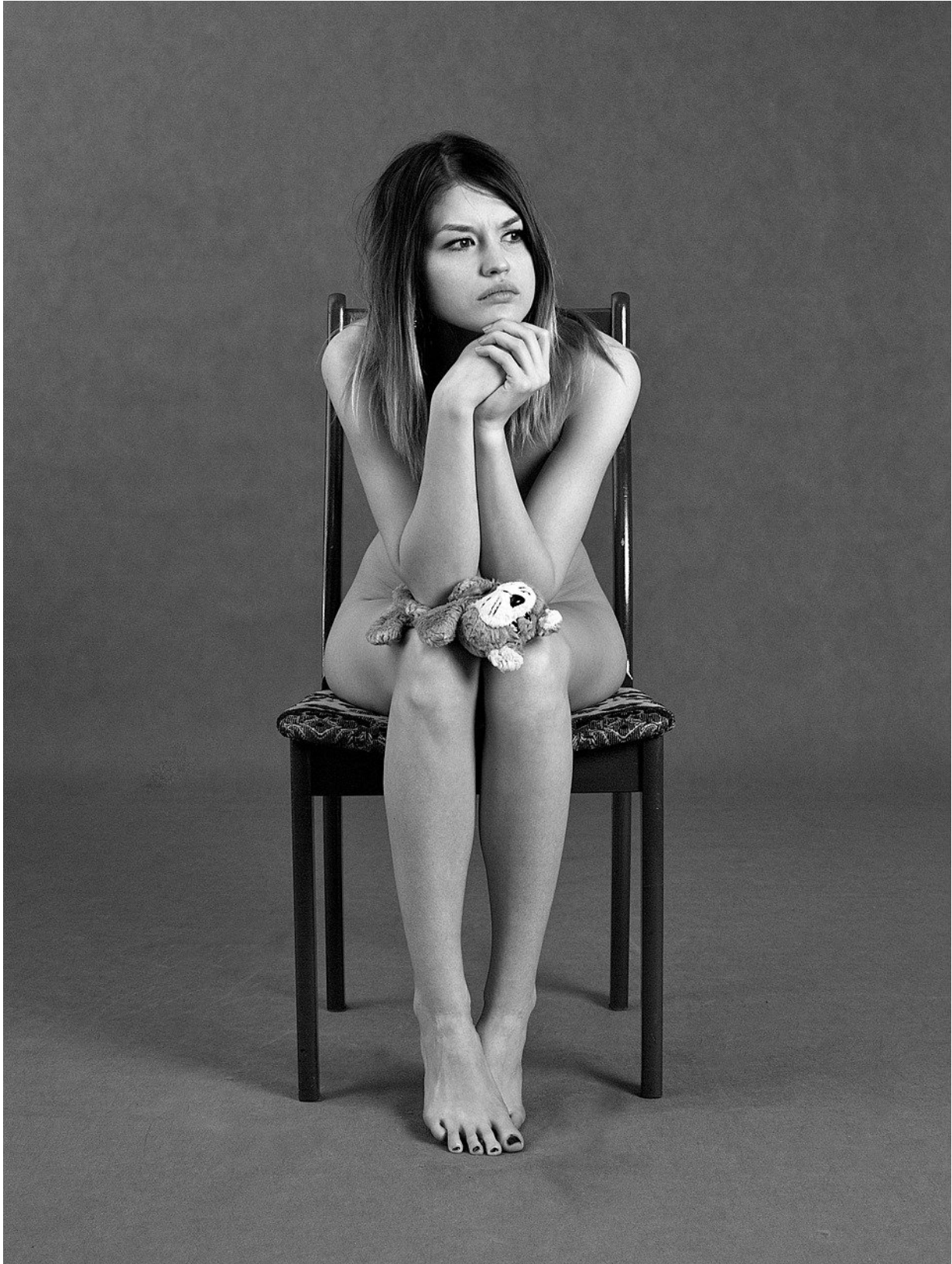

| <b>ruminatation</b>   | Regurgitation of small amounts of food; seen in some infants after feeding.<br><i>Ruminants have remarkable powers of <b>ruminatation</b>.</i>                       |
