Decisions are shaped by political calculations.


deliberateness A rate demonstrating an absence of haste or hurry.

meditative Relating to or absorbed in meditation or considered thought.

Meditative techniques.

(in Greek and Roman mythology) each of nine goddesses, the daughters of

Zeus and Mnemosyne, who preside over the arts and sciences.

Euterpe was his **muse**.

Reflect deeply on a subject.

She sat **ponder**ing over her problem.

A precautionary measure warding off impending danger or damage or
