amount	Be tantamount or equivalent to. <i>The substance is harmless if taken in small amounts.</i>
calculation	A mathematical determination of the amount or number of something. <i>Finding ways of saving money involves complicated calculations.</i>
careful	Prudent in the use of something, especially money. <i>Careful with money.</i>
cautious	People who are fearful and cautious. <i>The plan received a cautious welcome.</i>
compute	Reckon or calculate (a figure or amount). <i>The hire charge is computed on a daily basis.</i>
computerize	Provide with computers. <i>Our office is fully computerized now.</i>
computing	The branch of engineering science that studies (with the aid of computers) computable processes and structures. <i>Computing facilities.</i>
consider	Show consideration for take into account. <i>I consider him irresponsible.</i>
counterfeit	Not genuine; imitating something superior. <i>Counterfeit emotion.</i>
discreetly	In an intentionally unobtrusive manner. <i>He discreetly inquired whether the position was still available.</i>
estimate	Judge tentatively or form an estimate of quantities or time. <i>An estimate of what it would cost.</i>
exactness	The quality of being accurate or correct; precision. <i>He demanded exactness in all details.</i>
forethought	Careful consideration of what will be necessary or may happen in the future. <i>Jim had the forethought to book in advance.</i>
forgery	A forged document, signature, banknote, or work of art. <i>He was found guilty of forgery.</i>
intended	Planned or meant. <i>Your intended trip abroad.</i>
juror	A member of a jury.
mathematical	Of or pertaining to or of the nature of mathematics. <i>A mathematical whiz.</i>

meditative	Relating to or absorbed in meditation or considered thought. <i>Meditative techniques.</i>
<u>muse</u>	(in Greek and Roman mythology) each of nine goddesses, the daughters of Zeus and Mnemosyne, who preside over the arts and sciences. <i>Euterpe was his muse.</i>
<u>ponder</u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>She sat pondering over her problem.</i>
precaution	A precautionary measure warding off impending danger or damage or injury etc. <i>He put an ice pack on the injury as a precaution.</i>
premeditated	(of an action, especially a crime) thought out or planned beforehand. <i>A premeditated crime.</i>
premeditation	Planning or plotting in advance of acting. <i>The defendant said there was no planning or premeditation.</i>
<u>prudent</u>	Careful and sensible; marked by sound judgment. <i>Prudent rulers.</i>
reckon	Include someone or something in (a class or group). <i>I don't reckon his chances.</i>
review	Hold a review of troops. <i>I reviewed his first novel.</i>
<u>sabotage</u>	A deliberate act of destruction or disruption in which equipment is damaged. <i>Power lines from South Africa were sabotaged by rebel forces.</i>
<u>sum</u>	Be a summary of. <i>The sum of his own knowledge.</i>
think	An instance of deliberate thinking. <i>Just think you could be rich one day.</i>
thoughtful	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>A deeply thoughtful essay.</i>
