bewitching	Enchanting or delightful. <i>I gazed deeply into the most bewitching blue eyes.</i>
captivating	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>Roosevelt was a captivating speaker.</i>
<u>charming</u>	Pleasing or delighting. <i>Endowed with charming manners.</i>
cute	Attractive especially by means of smallness or prettiness or quaintness. <i>A cute guy.</i>
delicious	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>Delicious home baked brown bread.</i>
<u>enchanting</u>	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Dinah looked enchanting.</i>

<u>endearing</u>	Inspiring affection. An <i>endearing</i> little grin.
engaging	Charming and attractive. An <i>engaging</i> smile.
<u>entrancing</u>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. I find you <i>entrancing</i> .
fetching	Very attractive; capturing interest. A <i>fetching</i> little garment of pink satin.
lovely	Very pleasant or enjoyable; delightful. We ve had a <i>lovely</i> day.
<u>sweet</u>	Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub. <i>Sweet</i> dessert wines.
very agreeable	Precisely as stated.
very pleasant	Precisely as stated.
very pleasurable	Precisely as stated.
winning	Very attractive; capturing interest. The <i>winning</i> team.

blessedness	The state of being blessed with divine favour.
<u>bliss</u>	A state of extreme happiness. <i>Blissed out hippies.</i>
<u>contentment</u>	A state of happiness and satisfaction. <i>He found contentment in living a simple life in the country.</i>
delighted	Greatly pleased. <i>We were delighted to see her.</i>
enjoy	Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in. <i>I enjoy watching good films.</i>

enjoyable	(of an activity or occasion) giving delight or pleasure. <i>They had an enjoyable afternoon.</i>

exult	Feel extreme happiness or elation. <i>Exulting in her escape Lisa closed the door behind her.</i>
exultant	Triumphantly happy. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
fascinated	Strongly attracted and interested. <i>A crowd of fascinated onlookers.</i>
glad	Showing or causing joy and pleasure; especially made happy. <i>Heard the glad news.</i>
gladden	Become glad or happy. <i>The high childish laugh was a sound that gladdened her heart.</i>
gratifying	Giving pleasure or satisfaction. <i>The results were gratifying.</i>
happiness	Emotions experienced when in a state of well-being. <i>Tom's heart swelled with happiness.</i>
happy	Satisfied with the quality or standard of. <i>They are happy to see me doing well.</i>
intriguing	Capable of arousing interest or curiosity. <i>Our team came up with some most intriguing finds.</i>
joy	Feel happiness or joy. <i>I felt shame that I had ever joyed in his discomfiture or pain.</i>
joyful	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. <i>Joyful music.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
pleasant	Affording pleasure; being in harmony with your taste or likings. <i>Pleasant sensations.</i>
pleasantness	The feeling caused by agreeable stimuli; one pole of a continuum of states of feeling. <i>The pleasantness of a cool breeze on a hot summer day.</i>

<u>pleased</u>	Feeling pleasurable satisfaction over something by which you measures your self-worth. <i>We will be pleased to provide an independent appraisal.</i>
pleasing	Satisfying or appealing. <i>A pleasing aroma.</i>
<u>pleasurable</u>	Pleasing; enjoyable. <i>I arrived in a mood of pleasurable anticipation.</i>
pleasure	An activity that affords enjoyment. <i>He was tingling with pleasure.</i>
rapture	(according to some millenarian teaching) transport (a believer) from earth to heaven at the Second Coming of Christ. <i>Leonora listened with rapture.</i>
rewarding	Providing satisfaction; gratifying. <i>A rewarding career as a paramedic.</i>
<u>thrilled</u>	Feeling intense pleasurable excitement.
