<b>explicitly</b>	In a clear and detailed manner, leaving no room for confusion or doubt. <i>The essay should state <b>explicitly</b> how the facts support the thesis.</i>
<b>expound</b>	State. <i>He was <b>expounding</b> a powerful argument.</i>
<b>narrative</b>	A spoken or written account of connected events; a story. <i>A <b>narrative</b> poem.</i>
<b>outline</b>	Draw up an outline or sketch for something. <i>The chalked <b>outline</b> of a human body.</i>
<b>portray</b>	Portray in words. <i>He chose Trevor Howard to <b>portray</b> Captain Bligh.</i>
<b>precis</b>	Make a precis of a text or speech.
<b>profile</b>	Represent in profile by drawing or painting. <i>In soft rocks a <b>profile</b> drawn normally to the beach would show a concave form comparable with the long <b>profile</b> of a river.</i>
<b>prospectus</b>	A formal written offer to sell securities (filed with the SEC) that sets forth a plan for a (proposed) business enterprise. <i>A <b>prospectus</b> should contain the facts that an investor needs to make an informed decision.</i>
<b>quote</b>	Put quote marks around. <i>Use double <b>quotes</b> around precise phrases you wish to search for.</i>
<b>recapitulate</b>	Summarize and state again the main points of. <i>Let s <b>recapitulate</b> the main ideas.</i>
<b>resume</b>	Take or put on again. <i>He sipped at the glass of water and then <b>resumed</b>.</i>
<b>scribble</b>	A piece of writing or a picture produced carelessly or hurriedly. <i>He took the clipboard and <b>scribbled</b> something illegible.</i>

<b><u>sketch</u></b>	Make a sketch of. <i>Jeanne <b>sketched</b> and painted whenever she had the time.</i>
<b><u>specify</u></b>	Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an express demand or provision in an agreement. <b>Specify</b> the parameters.
<b>stipulate</b>	Demand or specify (a requirement), typically as part of an agreement. <i>They <b>stipulated</b> to release all the prisoners.</i>
<b><u>summarize</u></b>	Be a summary of. <i>These results can be <b>summarized</b> in the following table.</i>
<b>summary</b>	(of a judicial process) conducted without the customary legal formalities. <i>A <b>summary</b> formulation of a wide ranging subject.</i>
<b><u>synopsis</u></b>	A sketchy summary of the main points of an argument or theory. <i>A <b>synopsis</b> of the insurance cover provided is set out below.</i>
<b>transcript</b>	A length of RNA or DNA that has been transcribed respectively from a DNA or RNA template. <i>You can obtain a <b>transcript</b> of this radio program by sending a self addressed envelope to the station.</i>
<b><u>vignette</u></b>	Produce a photograph in the style of a vignette by softening or shading away the edges of the subject. <i>A classic <b>vignette</b> of embassy life.</i>
