

expound	State. He was <b>expound</b> ing a powerful argument.
<u>narrative</u>	A spoken or written account of connected events; a story. A <b>narrative</b> poem.
outline	Draw up an outline or sketch for something. The chalked <b>outline</b> of a human body.
portray	Portray in words. He chose Trevor Howard to <b>portray</b> Captain Bligh.
precis	Make a precis of a text or speech.
profile	Represent in profile by drawing or painting. In soft rocks a <b>profile</b> drawn normally to the beach would show a concave form comparable with the long <b>profile</b> of a river.
prospectus	A formal written offer to sell securities (filed with the SEC) that sets forth a plan for a (proposed) business enterprise. A <b>prospectus</b> should contain the facts that an investor needs to make an informed decision.
<u>quote</u>	Put quote marks around. Use double <b>quote</b> s around precise phrases you wish to search for.
recapitulate	Summarize and state again the main points of. Let s <b>recapitulate</b> the main ideas.
resume	Take or put on again. <i>He sipped at the glass of water and then</i> <b>resume</b> d.
scribble	A piece of writing or a picture produced carelessly or hurriedly. <i>He took the clipboard and <b>scribble</b>d something illegible.</i>



<u>sketch</u>	Make a sketch of. Jeanne <b>sketch</b> ed and painted whenever she had the time.
<u>specify</u>	Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an express demand or provision in an agreement. <i>Specify the parameters.</i>
stipulate	Demand or specify (a requirement), typically as part of an agreement. They <b>stipulate</b> d to release all the prisoners.

transcript	A length of RNA or DNA that has been transcribed respectively from a DNA or RNA template. You can obtain a <b>transcript</b> of this radio program by sending a self addressed envelope to the station.
<u>vignette</u>	Produce a photograph in the style of a vignette by softening or shading away the edges of the subject. A classic <b>vignette</b> of embassy life.
