Associations of "Deliverables" (30 Words)

address	Address or apply oneself to something direct one's efforts towards something such as a question. <i>I addressed my letter to him personally.</i>
asset	A useful or valuable quality. <i>The school is an asset to the community.</i>
belonging	Happiness felt in a secure relationship. <i>With his classmates he felt a sense of belonging.</i>
beneficial	Relating to rights to the use or benefit of property, other than legal title. <i>The process was beneficial to both supplier and customer.</i>
benefit	Derive a benefit from. <i>The changes are of benefit to commerce.</i>
commodity	A raw material or primary agricultural product that can be bought and sold, such as copper or coffee. <i>Water is a precious commodity.</i>
externalize	Project (a mental image or process) on to a figure outside oneself. <i>Elements of the internal construction were externalized on to the facade.</i>
forfeited	Surrendered as a penalty.
fungible	Of goods or commodities; freely exchangeable for or replaceable by another of like nature or kind in the satisfaction of an obligation. <i>It is by no means the world's only fungible commodity.</i>
healthiness	The state of being vigorous and free from bodily or mental disease.
hemorrhage	Lose blood from one's body.
mail	Send someone email. <i>He works for the United States mail service.</i>
merchandise	Engage in the trade of. <i>Shops which offered an astonishing range of merchandise.</i>

misappropriate	Dishonestly or unfairly take (something, especially money, belonging to another) for one's own use. <i>The report revealed that department officials had misappropriated funds.</i>
mislaid	Place (something) where one cannot find it again. <i>I seem to have mislaid my car keys.</i>
objectify	Express (something abstract) in a concrete form. <i>A deeply sexist attitude that objectifies women.</i>
owned	Having an owner; often used in combination. <i>State owned railways.</i>
payee	A person to whom money is paid or is to be paid, especially the person to whom a cheque is made payable.
post	A goalpost. <i>In England they call mail the post.</i>
product	A person whose character and identity have been formed by a particular period or situation. <i>That store offers a variety of products.</i>
property	Shares or investments in property. <i>The stolen property was not recovered.</i>
proprietorship	An unincorporated business owned by a single person who is responsible for its liabilities and entitled to its profits. <i>The company was established in 1912 and is still under the proprietorship of the same family.</i>
resource	The ability to deal resourcefully with unusual problems. <i>Local authorities complained that they lacked resources.</i>
sale	The activity or business of selling products. <i>They tried to boost sales.</i>
squander	Allow (an opportunity) to pass or be lost. <i>You squandered the opportunity to get an advanced degree.</i>
stock	Fit a rifle or other firearm with a stock. <i>The fat can be used as soap stock.</i>
thing	Used to express one's disapproval of or contempt for something. <i>It is a remarkable thing.</i>
trading	Buying or selling securities or commodities. <i>Trading profits leapt.</i>
value	Fix or determine the value of; assign a value to. <i>He has old-fashioned values.</i>
