A person or thing intended to deceive others, typically by unjustifiably

claiming or being credited with accomplishments or qualities.

Prosecutions for social security **fraud**s.

Fraudulent psychics.

Subject to a playful hoax or joke. A **hoax** 999 call.

Conceal one's true motives from especially by elaborately feigning good

intentions so as to gain an end.

hoodwink

shotgun.

humbug Pretentious or silly talk or writing.

His comments are sheer **humbug**.

liar A person who tells lies.

Shelley wasn t a good **liar**.

Deprive of by deceit.

mulct A rapacious old woman who would never miss the few dollars mulcted of

her.

peculation The fraudulent appropriation of funds or property entrusted to your care

but actually owned by someone else.

perfidyAn act of deliberate betrayal.

It was an example of his **perfidy**.

Perform an act, usually with a negative connotation.

Perpetrate a crime.

phonyA person who professes beliefs and opinions that he or she does not hold in

order to conceal his or her real feelings or motives.

Take part in a rebellion renounce a former allegiance.

scam Swindle.

An insurance **scam**.

swindle Use deception to deprive (someone) of money or possessions.

He **swindle**d me out of my inheritance.
