chimerical	Produced by a wildly fanciful imagination- Douglas Bush. His Utopia is not a chimerical commonwealth but a practical improvement on what already exists.
confusion	A situation of panic or disorder. There seems to be some confusion about which system does what.
daydream	Indulge in a daydream. She looked out the window daydream ing.
<u>disarray</u>	A state of disorganization or untidiness. Attendant damsels to help to disarray her.
<u>dream</u>	See hear or feel something in a dream. Maybe you dream ed it.
<u>dystopia</u>	An imagined state or society in which there is great suffering or injustice, typically one that is totalitarian or post-apocalyptic.
<u>fantasy</u>	A genre of imaginative fiction involving magic and adventure, especially in a setting other than the real world. A <i>fantasy</i> world.
forgetfulness	Lapse of memory. She teased him for his forgetfulness .
hallucinate	Experience a hallucination of (something. Ben began hallucinating and having fits.
hallucination	A mistaken or unfounded opinion or idea. <i>His dreams of vast wealth are a hallucination.</i>



hallucinatory	Characterized by or characteristic of hallucination – Jean Stafford. A hallucinatory fantasy.
illusion	An erroneous mental representation. He had no illusion s about the trouble she was in.
illusive	Based on or having the nature of an illusion. An illusive haven.
illusory	Based on or having the nature of an illusion. She knew the safety of her room was illusory .
<u>imaginary</u>	Not based on fact; unreal- F.D.Roosevelt. Chris had imaginary conversations with her.
imagination	The ability of the mind to be creative or resourceful. She d never been blessed with a vivid imagination .
megalomania	A psychological state characterized by delusions of grandeur.
neurosis	A mental or personality disturbance not attributable to any known neurological or organic dysfunction. <i>Freud s two stage account of neurosis.</i>
<u>oblivion</u>	The state of being disregarded or forgotten. Only our armed forces stood between us and oblivion .
<u>paranoia</u>	A psychological disorder characterized by delusions of persecution or grandeur. Mild paranoia afflicts all prime ministers.
paranoiac	Suffering from or relating to paranoia. A bunch of paranoiac s and conspiracy theorists.
<u>paranoid</u>	A person who is paranoid. You think I m paranoid but I tell you there is something going on.
psychosis	Any severe mental disorder in which contact with reality is lost or highly distorted. <i>They were suffering from a psychosis.</i>
<u>reverie</u>	A fanciful or impractical idea or theory. He defended and explained all the reverie s of astrology.
schizophrenia	Any of several psychotic disorders characterized by distortions of reality and disturbances of thought and language and withdrawal from social contact. <i>Gibraltar s schizophrenia</i> continues to be fed by colonial pride.
<u>surreal</u>	Having the qualities of surrealism bizarre. As irrational and surreal as a dream.
