## Associations of "Delved" (30 Words)

<b>archaeologist</b>	A person who studies human history and prehistory through the excavation of sites and the analysis of artefacts and other physical remains. <i>Chinese <b>archaeologists</b> uncovered life sized terracotta statues.</i>
<b>burrow</b>	Dig into or through something solid. <i><b>Burrow</b> through the forest.</i>
<b>colliery</b>	A workplace consisting of a coal mine plus all the buildings and equipment connected with it.
<b>coxswain</b>	The senior petty officer in a small ship or submarine in the Royal Navy.
<b>dig</b>	An act or spell of digging. <i><b>Dig</b> out a channel.</i>
<b>disinter</b>	Dig up (something that has been buried, especially a corpse). <i>He has <b>disinterred</b> an important collection of writings.</i>
<b>dug</b>	An udder or breast or teat.
<b>excavate</b>	Dig out material from (the ground). <i>The cheapest way of doing this was to <b>excavate</b> a long trench.</i>
<b>excavation</b>	The act of digging. <i>The methods of <b>excavation</b> have to be extremely rigorous.</i>
<b>exhume</b>	Dig out (something buried, especially a corpse) from the ground. <i>The bodies were <b>exhumed</b> on the orders of a judge.</i>
<b>furrow</b>	Cut a furrow into a columns. <i>A look of concern <b>furrowed</b> his brow.</i>
<b>gold</b>	Coins made of gold. <i>He proved to be a rabid seeker for <b>gold</b> and power.</i>
<b>granite</b>	Something having the quality of granite unyielding firmness. <i>A man with <b>granite</b> determination.</i>

<b>gravel</b>	A mixture of gravel with coarse sand used for paths and roads and as an aggregate. <i>Steps lead down from the terrace to a <b>gravelled</b> path.</i>
<b>groove</b>	A long narrow furrow cut either by a natural process such as erosion or by a tool as e.g. a groove in a phonograph record. <i>His thoughts were slipping into a familiar <b>groove</b>.</i>
<b>harrow</b>	Draw a harrow over land. <i>Todd could take it whereas I m <b>harrowed</b> by it.</i>
<b>hole</b>	Hit the ball into a hole. <i>Stephen lost the first three <b>holes</b> to Eric.</i>
<b>inhume</b>	Bury. <i>No hand his bones shall gather or <b>inhume</b>.</i>
<b>investigate</b>	Investigate scientifically. <i>Everyone with a possible interest in your brother s death must be thoroughly <b>investigated</b>.</i>
<b>mine</b>	Excavation in the earth from which ores and minerals are extracted. <i>The Vietnamese <b>mined</b> Cambodia.</i>
<b>pit</b>	Sink in or contract so as to form a pit or hollow. <i>A bear <b>pit</b>.</i>
<b>plow</b>	Move in a way resembling that of a plow cutting into or going through the soil. <i>Farmer Jones <b>plowed</b> his east field last week.</i>
<b>quarry</b>	Extract stone or other materials from a quarry. <i>A limestone <b>quarry</b>.</i>
<b>scoop</b>	A quantity taken up by a scoop. <i>What s the <b>scoop</b> old timer.</i>
<b>seed</b>	Give a competitor the status of seed in a tournament. <i>After <b>seeding</b> forage into the duff they now have grassland mixed with mature forest.</i>
<b>shovel</b>	Dig with or as if with a shovel. <i><b>Shovel</b> sand.</i>
<b>tiller</b>	Grow shoots in the form of stools or tillers.
<b>turnover</b>	The rate at which employees leave a workforce and are replaced. <i>The team were sitting on their lead and taking care to avoid <b>turnovers</b>.</i>
<b>underground</b>	An underground railway especially the one in London. <i><b>Underground</b> caverns.</i>
