Associations of "Delved" (30 Words)

archaeologist	A person who studies human history and prehistory through the excavation of sites and the analysis of artefacts and other physical remains. <i>Chinese archaeologists uncovered life sized terracotta statues.</i>
burrow	Dig into or through something solid. <i>Burrow through the forest.</i>
colliery	A workplace consisting of a coal mine plus all the buildings and equipment connected with it.
coxswain	The senior petty officer in a small ship or submarine in the Royal Navy.
dig	An act or spell of digging. <i>Dig out a channel.</i>
disinter	Dig up (something that has been buried, especially a corpse). <i>He has disinterred an important collection of writings.</i>
dug	An udder or breast or teat.
excavate	Dig out material from (the ground). <i>The cheapest way of doing this was to excavate a long trench.</i>
excavation	The act of digging. <i>The methods of excavation have to be extremely rigorous.</i>
exhume	Dig out (something buried, especially a corpse) from the ground. <i>The bodies were exhumed on the orders of a judge.</i>
furrow	Cut a furrow into a columns. <i>A look of concern furrowed his brow.</i>
gold	Coins made of gold. <i>He proved to be a rabid seeker for gold and power.</i>
granite	Something having the quality of granite unyielding firmness. <i>A man with granite determination.</i>

gravel	A mixture of gravel with coarse sand used for paths and roads and as an aggregate. <i>Steps lead down from the terrace to a gravelled path.</i>
groove	A long narrow furrow cut either by a natural process such as erosion or by a tool as e.g. a groove in a phonograph record. <i>His thoughts were slipping into a familiar groove.</i>
harrow	Draw a harrow over land. <i>Todd could take it whereas I m harrowed by it.</i>
hole	Hit the ball into a hole. <i>Stephen lost the first three holes to Eric.</i>
inhume	Bury. <i>No hand his bones shall gather or inhume.</i>
investigate	Investigate scientifically. <i>Everyone with a possible interest in your brother's death must be thoroughly investigated.</i>
mine	Excavation in the earth from which ores and minerals are extracted. <i>The Vietnamese mined Cambodia.</i>
pit	Sink in or contract so as to form a pit or hollow. <i>A bear pit.</i>
plow	Move in a way resembling that of a plow cutting into or going through the soil. <i>Farmer Jones plowed his east field last week.</i>
quarry	Extract stone or other materials from a quarry. <i>A limestone quarry.</i>
scoop	A quantity taken up by a scoop. <i>What's the scoop old timer.</i>
seed	Give a competitor the status of seed in a tournament. <i>After seeding forage into the duff they now have grassland mixed with mature forest.</i>
shovel	Dig with or as if with a shovel. <i>Shovel sand.</i>
tiller	Grow shoots in the form of stools or tillers.
turnover	The rate at which employees leave a workforce and are replaced. <i>The team were sitting on their lead and taking care to avoid turnovers.</i>
underground	An underground railway especially the one in London. <i>Underground caverns.</i>
