### [border](#)

A district near the border between two areas.  
*She stitched a **border** on to one of the plain white saris.*

### [borderline](#)

A boundary separating two countries or areas.  
*The **borderline** between ritual and custom.*

### [bound](#)

The greatest possible degree of something.  
*I went up the steps in two effortless **bounds**.*

### [boundary](#)

A limit of something abstract, especially a subject or sphere of activity.  
*A **boundary** wall.*

### **contrast**

The opposition or dissimilarity of things that are compared.  
*By **contrast**.*

**demarcation line** The maximum credit that a customer is allowed.

<b><u>differentiation</u></b>	A discrimination between things as different and distinct. <i>Cell <b>differentiation</b> in the developing embryo.</i>
<b><u>distinction</u></b>	A discrimination between things as different and distinct. <i>She graduated with the highest <b>distinction</b>.</i>
<b>dividing line</b>	A serious disagreement between two groups of people (typically producing tension or hostility).
<b>division</b>	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>Two infantry <b>divisions</b> were held in reserve.</i>
<b><u>frontier</u></b>	An undeveloped field of study; a topic inviting research and development. <i>The <b>frontier</b> between thought and reality is confused.</i>
<b>limit</b>	Final or latest limiting point. <i>The upper <b>limit</b> of the tidal reaches.</i>
<b>line</b>	A contour or outline considered as a feature of design or composition. <i>Let me show you my etchings is a rather worn <b>line</b>.</i>
<b><u>separation</u></b>	The social act of separating or parting company. <i>He hid in the <b>separation</b> between walls.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Demarcation" as a noun

- *A horizontal band that produces a distinct demarcation two inches from the top.*
