- behavior** Behavioral attributes the way a person behaves toward other people.
*The **behavior** of small particles can be studied in experiments.*
- behaviour** The way in which a machine or natural phenomenon works or functions.
***Behaviour** patterns.*
- conduct** Manner of acting or controlling yourself.
*The **conduct** of the elections.*
- demeanour** (behavioral attributes) the way a person behaves toward other people.
*His happy **demeanour**.*
- deportment** (behavioral attributes) the way a person behaves toward other people.
*There are team rules governing **deportment** on and off the field.*

Take action do something.
*They urged Washington to **act**.*

attitude

A theatrical pose created for effect.
*He was questioned on his **attitude** to South Africa.*

bearing

Characteristic way of bearing one's body.
*A man of precise military **bearing**.*

behave

Behave in a certain manner show a certain behavior conduct or comport oneself.
*They were expected to **behave** themselves.*

behavior

Behavioral attributes the way a person behaves toward other people.
*The **behavior** of small particles can be studied in experiments.*

behaviour

The way in which an animal or person behaves in response to a particular situation or stimulus.
*The erratic **behaviour** of the old car.*

calm	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to. <i>Remained calm throughout the uproar.</i>
chilly	Not characterized by emotion-C.W.Cunningham. <i>I felt a bit chilly.</i>
comport	Behave well or properly. <i>Articulate students who comported themselves well in interviews.</i>
composed	Having one's feelings and expression under control; calm. <i>A very talented and composed young player.</i>
conduct	Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction. <i>Heat is conducted to the surface.</i>
coolheaded	Marked by calm self-control (especially in trying circumstances); unemotional. <i>Stayed coolheaded in the crisis.</i>
deed	Convey or transfer property or rights by legal deed. <i>They deeded their property to their children.</i>
ethology	The study of human behaviour and social organization from a biological perspective.
icily	In a cold and icy manner.
noiseless	Making no sound. <i>Th inaudible and noiseless foot of time.</i>
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
placid	Not easily upset or excited. <i>A placid contented man.</i>
prissy	Exaggeratedly proper. <i>A middle class family with two prissy children.</i>
prudery	Excessive or affected modesty.
prudish	Exaggeratedly proper. <i>The prudish moral climate of the late 19th century.</i>
quietude	A state of peace and quiet. <i>It highlights her quietude and wise passivity.</i>
repose	Be inherent or innate in. <i>I ll go to him and repose our distresses on his friendly bosom.</i>
sedate	Calm, dignified, and unhurried. <i>A quiet sedate nature.</i>
serene	An expanse of clear sky or calm sea. <i>Serene skies and a bright blue sea.</i>
tranquility	A state of peace and quiet.

- tranquilize** Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
- tranquillity** A disposition free from stress or emotion.
*Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the **tranquillity** of rural life.*
- Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure.
- unflappable** *I prided myself on being **unflappable** even in the most chaotic circumstances.*
- unsociable** Not enjoying or making an effort to behave sociably in the company of others.
***Unsociable** behavior.*
