## Associations of "Demographic" (30 Words)

<b>administer</b>	Administer or bestow as in small portions. <i><b>Administer</b> an exam.</i>
<b>analyst</b>	A psychoanalyst.
<b>breathalyzer</b>	A device that measures chemicals (especially the alcohol content) in a person’s expired breath.
<b>censor</b>	Subject to political religious or moral censorship. <i>The report was approved by the military <b>censors</b>.</i>
<b>critically</b>	In a critical manner. <i>The reader must evaluate <b>critically</b> every article he or she reviews.</i>
<b>econometrics</b>	The application of mathematics and statistics to the study of economic and financial data.
<b>examination</b>	The action or process of conducting an examination. <i>An <b>examination</b> of marketing behaviour.</i>
<b>inquiry</b>	An instance of questioning. <i>He was one of the State s star witnesses in the murder <b>inquiry</b>.</i>
<b>inspection</b>	A formal or official examination. <i>We carry out regular safety <b>inspections</b>.</i>
<b>inspector</b>	A police officer ranking below a chief inspector. <i>A prison <b>inspector</b>.</i>
<b>measurement</b>	The size, length, or amount of something, as established by measuring. <i>A telescope with which precise <b>measurements</b> can be made.</i>
<b>oversee</b>	Watch and direct. <i>Who is <b>overseeing</b> this project.</i>
<b>poll</b>	Cut off the top of a tree or plant typically to encourage further growth pollard. <i>The Green candidate <b>polled</b> 3 6 per cent.</i>

<b>pollster</b>	A person who conducts or analyses opinion polls. <i>A <b>pollster</b> conducts public opinion polls.</i>
<b>polygraph</b>	A lie detector test carried out with a polygraph. <i>If he passed the <b>polygraph</b> of course it would authenticate his story.</i>
<b>population</b>	All the inhabitants of a particular place. <i>A city with a large student <b>population</b>.</i>
<b>probability</b>	The quality or state of being probable; the extent to which something is likely to happen or be the case. <i>The <b>probability</b> that an unbiased coin will fall with the head up is 0.5.</i>
<b>reaffirm</b>	State again strongly. <i>He <b>reaffirmed</b> his faith in the church.</i>
<b>reconnoiter</b>	Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.
<b>reexamine</b>	Look at again; examine again.
<b>review</b>	Hold a review of troops. <i>The Home Secretary was called on to <b>review</b> Britain's gun laws.</i>
<b>scrutiny</b>	The act of examining something closely (as for mistakes). <i>Every aspect of local government was placed under <b>scrutiny</b>.</i>
<b>statistic</b>	A fact or piece of data obtained from a study of a large quantity of numerical data. <i>The <b>statistics</b> show that the crime rate has increased.</i>
<b>surveillance</b>	Close observation, especially of a suspected spy or criminal. <i>He found himself put under <b>surveillance</b> by British military intelligence.</i>
<b>survey</b>	An act of surveying a building. <i>Her green eyes <b>surveyed</b> him coolly.</i>
<b>terrain</b>	A piece of ground having specific characteristics or military potential. <i>A <b>terrain</b> of low green hills.</i>
<b>test</b>	The act of testing something. <i>A positive <b>test</b> for protein.</i>
<b>undervalue</b>	A price below the real value. <i>His truck was sold at an <b>undervalue</b>.</i>
<b>voter</b>	A citizen who has a legal right to vote.
<b>watchdog</b>	A guardian or defender against theft or illegal practices or waste. <i>How can we <b>watchdog</b> our investments.</i>
