Associations of "Demographic" (30 Words)

administer	Administer or bestow as in small portions. <i>Administer an exam.</i>
analyst	A psychoanalyst.
breathalyzer	A device that measures chemicals (especially the alcohol content) in a person’s expired breath.
censor	Subject to political religious or moral censorship. <i>The report was approved by the military censors.</i>
critically	In a critical manner. <i>The reader must evaluate critically every article he or she reviews.</i>
econometrics	The application of mathematics and statistics to the study of economic and financial data.
examination	The action or process of conducting an examination. <i>An examination of marketing behaviour.</i>
inquiry	An instance of questioning. <i>He was one of the State s star witnesses in the murder inquiry.</i>
inspection	A formal or official examination. <i>We carry out regular safety inspections.</i>
inspector	A police officer ranking below a chief inspector. <i>A prison inspector.</i>
measurement	The size, length, or amount of something, as established by measuring. <i>A telescope with which precise measurements can be made.</i>
oversee	Watch and direct. <i>Who is overseeing this project.</i>
poll	Cut off the top of a tree or plant typically to encourage further growth pollard. <i>The Green candidate polled 3 6 per cent.</i>

pollster	A person who conducts or analyses opinion polls. <i>A pollster conducts public opinion polls.</i>
polygraph	A lie detector test carried out with a polygraph. <i>If he passed the polygraph of course it would authenticate his story.</i>
population	All the inhabitants of a particular place. <i>A city with a large student population.</i>
probability	The quality or state of being probable; the extent to which something is likely to happen or be the case. <i>The probability that an unbiased coin will fall with the head up is 0.5.</i>
reaffirm	State again strongly. <i>He reaffirmed his faith in the church.</i>
reconnoiter	Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.
reexamine	Look at again; examine again.
review	Hold a review of troops. <i>The Home Secretary was called on to review Britain's gun laws.</i>
scrutiny	The act of examining something closely (as for mistakes). <i>Every aspect of local government was placed under scrutiny.</i>
statistic	A fact or piece of data obtained from a study of a large quantity of numerical data. <i>The statistics show that the crime rate has increased.</i>
surveillance	Close observation, especially of a suspected spy or criminal. <i>He found himself put under surveillance by British military intelligence.</i>
survey	An act of surveying a building. <i>Her green eyes surveyed him coolly.</i>
terrain	A piece of ground having specific characteristics or military potential. <i>A terrain of low green hills.</i>
test	The act of testing something. <i>A positive test for protein.</i>
undervalue	A price below the real value. <i>His truck was sold at an undervalue.</i>
voter	A citizen who has a legal right to vote.
watchdog	A guardian or defender against theft or illegal practices or waste. <i>How can we watchdog our investments.</i>
