Associations of "Demographics" (30 Words)

administer	Administer or bestow as in small portions. <i>A Health and Safety agency would administer new regulations.</i>
analyst	A psychoanalyst.
breathalyzer	A device that measures chemicals (especially the alcohol content) in a person’s expired breath.
censor	Subject to political religious or moral censorship. <i>The report was approved by the military censors.</i>
critically	In a way that involves the objective analysis and evaluation of an issue in order to form a judgement. <i>The reader must evaluate critically every article he or she reviews.</i>
econometrics	The branch of economics concerned with the use of mathematical methods (especially statistics) in describing economic systems.
examination	The action or process of conducting an examination. <i>The role of the planning system has come under increasing critical examination.</i>
inquiry	An instance of questioning. <i>All lines of inquiry are open.</i>
inspection	Careful examination or scrutiny. <i>We had to wait for the inspection before we could use the elevator.</i>
inspector	A police officer ranking below a chief inspector. <i>A prison inspector.</i>
measurement	The act or process of assigning numbers to phenomena according to a rule. <i>A hand is a measurement used for measuring horses.</i>
oversee	Watch and direct. <i>The Home Secretary oversees the police service.</i>

poll	Cut off the top of a tree or plant typically to encourage further growth pollard. <i>There were some beautiful willows and now the idiot Parson has polled them into wretched stumps.</i>
pollster	Someone who conducts surveys of public opinion. <i>A pollster conducts public opinion polls.</i>
polygraph	A lie detector test carried out with a polygraph. <i>If he passed the polygraph of course it would authenticate his story.</i>
population	The action of populating a place. <i>A city with a large student population.</i>
probability	The extent to which an event is likely to occur, measured by the ratio of the favourable cases to the whole number of cases possible. <i>A probability of 0.5.</i>
reaffirm	Affirm once again. <i>He reaffirmed his faith in the church.</i>
reconnoiter	Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.
reexamine	Look at again; examine again.
review	Hold a review of troops. <i>Cue and review which plays the tape backwards or forwards at high speed.</i>
scrutiny	Critical observation or examination. <i>Every aspect of local government was placed under scrutiny.</i>
statistic	A fact or piece of data obtained from a study of a large quantity of numerical data. <i>The statistics show that the crime rate has increased.</i>
surveillance	Close observation, especially of a suspected spy or criminal. <i>He found himself put under surveillance by British military intelligence.</i>
survey	A department carrying out the surveying of land. <i>He surveyed his new classmates.</i>
terrain	A stretch of land, especially with regard to its physical features. <i>They decided to attack across the rocky terrain.</i>
test	Judge or measure someone's proficiency or knowledge by means of a test. <i>He tested positive for HIV.</i>
undervalue	Assign too low a value to. <i>The company's assets were undervalued in its balance sheet.</i>
voter	A person who votes or has the right to vote at an election.
watchdog	A dog kept to guard private property. <i>The consumer watchdog for transport in London.</i>
