**dismantled** Torn down and broken up.

**razed** Torn down and broken up.



## Associations of "Demolished" (30 Words)

- annihilate** Convert (a subatomic particle) into radiant energy.  
*A fraction of the mass of atomic nuclei is **annihilated**.*
- blighted** Affected by blight; anything that mars or prevents growth or prosperity.  
*A **blighted** rose.*
- break** Do a break dance.  
*The book dealer would not **break** the set.*
- breakage** Reimbursement for goods damaged while in transit or in use.  
*There had been three **breakages** in the overhead wires.*
- breaker** A quarry worker who splits off blocks of stone.  
*Those steam engines were now gone to the **breaker**'s yard.*
- bust** Go to pieces.  
*A 36 inch **bust**.*

<b>damage</b>	Suffer or be susceptible to damage. <i>The <b>damage</b> to his reputation was considerable.</i>
<b>demolition</b>	An event (or the result of an event) that completely destroys something. <i>Ireland s <b>demolition</b> of England.</i>
<b>destroy</b>	Destroy completely damage irreparably. <i>Northants have the batting to <b>destroy</b> anyone.</i>
<b><u>destruction</u></b>	A final state. <i>The wanton <b>destruction</b> of human life.</i>
<b>devastate</b>	Cause extensive destruction or ruin utterly. <i>He was <b>devastated</b> by his grief when his son died.</i>
<b>devastation</b>	The termination of something by causing so much damage to it that it cannot be repaired or no longer exists. <i>Her departure left him in utter <b>devastation</b>.</i>
<b>dilapidated</b>	In deplorable condition. <i>Old <b>dilapidated</b> buildings.</i>
<b>dilapidation</b>	A cause of action to force a tenant to pay for dilapidations. <i>The mill was in a state of <b>dilapidation</b>.</i>
<b><u>dismantle</u></b>	Take (a machine or structure) to pieces. <i>The old regime was <b>dismantled</b>.</i>
<b><u>dispatch</u></b>	The sending of someone or something to a destination or for a purpose. <i>He conducted meetings for the correspondents and censored their <b>dispatches</b>.</i>
<b>eliminate</b>	Eliminate from the body. <i>Let s <b>eliminate</b> the course on Akkadian hieroglyphics.</i>
<b>iconoclasm</b>	The action of attacking or assertively rejecting cherished beliefs and institutions or established values and practices.
<b>kaput</b>	Destroyed or killed. <i>The water pump s broken <b>kaput</b>.</i>
<b>moribund</b>	(of a thing) in terminal decline; lacking vitality or vigour. <i>A <b>moribund</b> patient.</i>
<b>obviate</b>	Prevent the occurrence of; prevent from happening. <i>The presence of roller blinds <b>obviated</b> the need for curtains.</i>
<b>raze</b>	Completely destroy (a building, town, or other settlement). <i>Villages were <b>razed</b> to the ground.</i>
<b>removal</b>	The dismissal of someone from a job. <i>His fellow employees formed guards of honour at the <b>removal</b> and funeral.</i>

- ruin** Destruction achieved by causing something to be wrecked or ruined.  
*They don't know how to say no and that's been their **ruin**.*
- shatter** Break or cause to break suddenly and violently into pieces.  
*The window was **shattered** by a stone.*
- shipwreck** Cause to experience shipwreck.  
*The vessel was **shipwrecked**.*
- smash** An act or sound of something smashing.  
*Man dies in motorway **smash**.*
- spoil** The act of spoiling something by causing damage to it.  
*Her **spoiling** my dress was deliberate.*
- subversion** The act of subverting; as overthrowing or destroying a legally constituted government.  
*The ruthless **subversion** of democracy.*
- wreck** Involve someone in a shipwreck.  
*The **wreck** of their marriage.*
