bust Go to pieces.

A 36 inch bust.



**damage** Suffer or be susceptible to damage.

The **damage** to his reputation was considerable.

**demolition** An event (or the result of an event) that completely destroys something.

*Ireland* s **demolition** of England.

**destroy** Destroy completely damage irreparably.

Northants have the batting to **destroy** anyone.

**destruction** A final state.

The wanton **destruction** of human life.

**devastate** Cause extensive destruction or ruin utterly.

He was **devastate**d by his grief when his son died.

The termination of something by causing so much damage to it that it cannot

**devastation** be repaired or no longer exists.

Her departure left him in utter **devastation**.

dilapidated In deplorable condition.

Old **dilapidated** buildings.

**dilapidation** A cause of action to force a tenant to pay for dilapidations.

The mill was in a state of **dilapidation**.

dismantle Take (a machine or structure) to pieces.

The old regime was **dismantle**d.

The sending of someone or something to a destination or for a purpose.

**dispatch** He conducted meetings for the correspondents and censored their

dispatches.

**eliminate** Eliminate from the body.

Let s **eliminate** the course on Akkadian hieroglyphics.

iconoclasm The action of attacking or assertively rejecting cherished beliefs and

institutions or established values and practices.

kaput Destroyed or killed.

The water pump s broken **kaput**.

moribund (of a thing) in terminal decline; lacking vitality or vigour.

A **moribund** patient.

**obviate** Prevent the occurrence of; prevent from happening.

The presence of roller blinds **obviate**d the need for curtains.

raze Completely destroy (a building, town, or other settlement.

Villages were **raze**d to the ground.

**removal** The dismissal of someone from a job.

His fellow employees formed guards of honour at the **removal** and funeral.



ruin Destruction achieved by causing something to be wrecked or ruined.

They don t know how to say no and that s been their **ruin**.

**shatter** Break or cause to break suddenly and violently into pieces.

The window was **shatter**ed by a stone.

**shipwreck** Cause to experience shipwreck. *The vessel was shipwrecked.* 

smash An act or sound of something smashing.

Man dies in motorway **smash**.

**spoil** The act of spoiling something by causing damage to it.

Her **spoil**ing my dress was deliberate.

The act of subverting; as overthrowing or destroying a legally constituted

**subversion** government.

The ruthless **subversion** of democracy.

Involve someone in a shipwreck.

The wreck of their marriage.
