- [annihilate](#)** Convert (a subatomic particle) into radiant energy.
*A fraction of the mass of atomic nuclei is **annihilated**.*
- blighted** Affected by blight; anything that mars or prevents growth or prosperity.
*A **blighted** rose.*
- break** Do a break dance.
*The book dealer would not **break** the set.*
- [breakage](#)** Reimbursement for goods damaged while in transit or in use.
*There had been three **breakages** in the overhead wires.*
- breaker** A quarry worker who splits off blocks of stone.
*Those steam engines were now gone to the **breaker**'s yard.*
- [bust](#)** Go to pieces.
*A 36 inch **bust**.*

damage	Suffer or be susceptible to damage. <i>The damage to his reputation was considerable.</i>
demolition	An event (or the result of an event) that completely destroys something. <i>Ireland s demolition of England.</i>
destroy	Destroy completely damage irreparably. <i>Northants have the batting to destroy anyone.</i>
<u>destruction</u>	A final state. <i>The wanton destruction of human life.</i>
devastate	Cause extensive destruction or ruin utterly. <i>He was devastated by his grief when his son died.</i>
devastation	The termination of something by causing so much damage to it that it cannot be repaired or no longer exists. <i>Her departure left him in utter devastation.</i>
dilapidated	In deplorable condition. <i>Old dilapidated buildings.</i>
dilapidation	A cause of action to force a tenant to pay for dilapidations. <i>The mill was in a state of dilapidation.</i>
<u>dismantle</u>	Take (a machine or structure) to pieces. <i>The old regime was dismantled.</i>
<u>dispatch</u>	The sending of someone or something to a destination or for a purpose. <i>He conducted meetings for the correspondents and censored their dispatches.</i>
eliminate	Eliminate from the body. <i>Let s eliminate the course on Akkadian hieroglyphics.</i>
iconoclasm	The action of attacking or assertively rejecting cherished beliefs and institutions or established values and practices.
kaput	Destroyed or killed. <i>The water pump s broken kaput.</i>
moribund	(of a thing) in terminal decline; lacking vitality or vigour. <i>A moribund patient.</i>
obviate	Prevent the occurrence of; prevent from happening. <i>The presence of roller blinds obviated the need for curtains.</i>
raze	Completely destroy (a building, town, or other settlement). <i>Villages were razed to the ground.</i>
removal	The dismissal of someone from a job. <i>His fellow employees formed guards of honour at the removal and funeral.</i>

- ruin** Destruction achieved by causing something to be wrecked or ruined.
*They don't know how to say no and that's been their **ruin**.*
- shatter** Break or cause to break suddenly and violently into pieces.
*The window was **shattered** by a stone.*
- shipwreck** Cause to experience shipwreck.
*The vessel was **shipwrecked**.*
- smash** An act or sound of something smashing.
*Man dies in motorway **smash**.*
- spoil** The act of spoiling something by causing damage to it.
*Her **spoiling** my dress was deliberate.*
- subversion** The act of subverting; as overthrowing or destroying a legally constituted government.
*The ruthless **subversion** of democracy.*
- wreck** Involve someone in a shipwreck.
*The **wreck** of their marriage.*
