

hysterical Affected by or deriving from wildly uncontrolled emotion.

Her attempts to teach them to dance were hysterical.

infernal Relating to or characteristic of hell or the underworld.

Infernal instruments of war.

mephistophelian Showing the cunning or ingenuity or wickedness typical of a devil.

A **mephistophelian** glint in his eye.

satanic Connected with satanism.

Satanic cruelty.

ungodly Irreligious or immoral.

Ungodly lives of lust and pleasure.

unholyUnnatural and potentially harmful.

She was making an unholy racket.

wicked Extremely unpleasant.

Despite the sun the wind outside was **wicked**.

wild Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation.

I m not **wild** about the music.
