<b>demoniac</b>	Frenzied as if possessed by a demon. <i>A goddess with both divine and <b>demoniac</b> qualities.</i>
<b>demoniacal</b>	Of, pertaining to, or like a demon or possession by a demon. <i>Towards midnight a <b>demoniacal</b> shriek was heard.</i>
<b><u>devilish</u></b>	Like or appropriate to a devil in evil and cruelty. <i>A wide <b>devilish</b> grin.</i>
<b>diabolic</b>	Showing the cunning or ingenuity or wickedness typical of a devil. <i><b>Diabolical</b> sorcerers under the influence of devils.</i>
<b><u>diabolical</u></b>	Showing the cunning or ingenuity or wickedness typical of a devil. <i>The <b>diabolical</b> expression on his face.</i>
<b>evil</b>	Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil. <i><b>Evil</b> deeds.</i>
<b><u>feverish</u></b>	Of or relating to or characterized by fever. <i>The next couple of weeks were spent in a whirl of <b>feverish</b> activity.</i>

<b>fiendish</b>	Extremely cruel or unpleasant. A <b>fiendish</b> despot.
<b>frantic</b>	Marked by uncontrolled excitement or emotion. She was <b>frantic</b> with worry.
<b>frenetic</b>	Fast and energetic in a rather wild and uncontrolled way. A <b>frenetic</b> pace of activity.
<b>frenzied</b>	Wildly excited or uncontrolled. A <b>frenzied</b> mob.
<b>furious</b>	As if showing violent anger. A <b>furious</b> battle.
<b>hectic</b>	Marked by intense agitation or emotion. A <b>hectic</b> business schedule.
<b>hellish</b>	Extremely difficult or unpleasant. It had been a <b>hellish</b> week.
<b>hysterical</b>	Affected by or deriving from wildly uncontrolled emotion. Her attempts to teach them to dance were <b>hysterical</b> .
<b>infernal</b>	Relating to or characteristic of hell or the underworld. <b>Infernal</b> instruments of war.
<b>mephistophelian</b>	Showing the cunning or ingenuity or wickedness typical of a devil. A <b>mephistophelian</b> glint in his eye.
<b>satanic</b>	Connected with satanism. <b>Satanic</b> cruelty.
<b>ungodly</b>	Irreligious or immoral. <b>Ungodly</b> lives of lust and pleasure.
<b>unholy</b>	Unnatural and potentially harmful. She was making an <b>unholy</b> racket.
<b>wicked</b>	Extremely unpleasant. Despite the sun the wind outside was <b>wicked</b> .
<b>wild</b>	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. I m not <b>wild</b> about the music.

## Associations of "Demonic" (30 Words)

<b>bad</b>	Feeling physical discomfort or pain tough is occasionally used colloquially for bad. <i><b>Bad</b> teeth.</i>
<b>barbarous</b>	(of language) coarse and unrefined. <i>A remote and <b>barbarous</b> country.</i>
<b>beastly</b>	In a beastly manner. <i><b>Beastly</b> desires.</i>
<b>cranky</b>	Inclined to heel over easily under sail. <i>A <b>cranky</b> scheme to pipe ground level ozone into the stratosphere.</i>
<b>dark</b>	Used of color having a dark hue. <i>The theater is <b>dark</b> on Mondays.</i>
<b>demon</b>	A forceful or skilful performer of a specified activity. <i>She s a <b>demon</b> at math.</i>
<b>depraved</b>	Morally corrupt; wicked. <i><b>Depraved</b> criminals.</i>

<b>devil</b>	An instrument or machine fitted with sharp teeth or spikes, used for tearing or other destructive work. <i>The work of the <b>devil</b>.</i>
<b>devilry</b>	Wicked and cruel behavior. <i>Some spirit of <b>devilry</b> made me go on teasing her.</i>
<b>diabolic</b>	Showing the cunning or ingenuity or wickedness typical of a devil. <i>The <b>diabolical</b> expression on his face.</i>
<b><u>diabolical</u></b>	Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell. <i>The <b>diabolical</b> expression on his face.</i>
<b>evil</b>	Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil. <i>No man is so <b>evil</b> as to be beyond redemption.</i>
<b>exorcise</b>	Expel through adjuration or prayers. <i><b>Exorcise</b> evil spirits.</i>
<b><u>fell</u></b>	The act of felling something as a tree.
<b>fiendish</b>	Extremely cruel or unpleasant. <i>A <b>fiendish</b> despot.</i>
<b><u>hellish</u></b>	(informal) very unpleasant. <i>It was <b>hellish</b> expensive.</i>
<b>immoral</b>	Deliberately violating accepted principles of right and wrong. <i>Unseemly and <b>immoral</b> behaviour.</i>
<b>impious</b>	Lacking due respect or dutifulness. <i><b>Impious</b> toward one's parents.</i>
<b>inhumane</b>	Without compassion for misery or suffering; cruel. <i>Humans are innately <b>inhumane</b> this explains much of the misery and suffering in the world.</i>
<b>malevolent</b>	Wishing or appearing to wish evil to others; arising from intense ill will or hatred. <i>Failure made him <b>malevolent</b> toward those who were successful.</i>
<b><u>malicious</u></b>	Characterized by malice; intending or intended to do harm. <i>He was found guilty of <b>malicious</b> damage.</i>
<b>maliciousness</b>	Feeling a need to see others suffer.
<b><u>mischief</u></b>	The quality or nature of being harmful or evil. <i>She'll make sure Danny doesn't get into <b>mischief</b>.</i>
<b>nefarious</b>	(typically of an action or activity) wicked or criminal. <i>The <b>nefarious</b> activities of the organized crime syndicates.</i>
<b>odious</b>	Unequivocally detestable- Edmund Burke. <i>Consequences <b>odious</b> to those you govern.</i>

<b>underworld</b>	(religion) the world of the dead. <i>A prominent <b>underworld</b> figure.</i>
<b>vice</b>	An immoral or wicked personal characteristic. <i>A mobile phone network is being used to peddle <b>vice</b>.</i>
<b>vicious</b>	Able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. <i><b>Vicious</b> kicks.</i>
<b>wicked</b>	Intended to or capable of harming someone or something. <i>A <b>wicked</b> stench.</i>
