<b>antenatal</b>	Occurring or existing before birth. <i><b>Antenatal</b> care.</i>
<a href="#">aunt</a>	The sister of your father or mother; the wife of your uncle. <i>She was brought up by her <b>aunt</b> and uncle.</i>
<a href="#">born</a>	British nuclear physicist born in Germany honored for his contributions to quantum mechanics 1882 1970. <i>She was <b>born</b> in Aberdeen.</i>
<a href="#">brother</a>	A (male) fellow Christian. <i>My <b>brother</b> still lives with our parents.</i>
<b>cousin</b>	A person of a kindred race or nation. <i>She s a distant <b>cousin</b>.</i>
<b>dad</b>	One’s father. <i>His <b>dad</b> was with him.</i>
<b>daddy</b>	The oldest, best, or biggest example of something. <i>It s you who s calling the shots now you re the <b>daddy</b>.</i>
<a href="#">daughter</a>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>Italian the eldest <b>daughter</b> of ancient Latin.</i>
<b>descendants</b>	All of the offspring of a given progenitor.
<b>family</b>	People descended from a common ancestor. <i>A <b>family</b> newspaper.</i>
<b>father</b>	Treat with the protective care associated with a father. <i>Pray for me <b>father</b>.</i>
<b>grandchild</b>	A child of your son or daughter.
<b>grandfather</b>	The father of your father or mother. <i>Freud is often called the <b>grandfather</b> of psychoanalysis.</i>
<b>grandparent</b>	A parent of your father or mother. <i>It must be a great blessing to have Chloe s <b>grandparents</b> living nearby.</i>

<b>maternal</b>	(of feelings) typical of a caring mother; motherly. <i>Warm <b>maternal</b> affection for her guest.</i>
<b>maternity</b>	The kinship relation between an offspring and the mother. <i>She is not a woman with an interest in <b>maternity</b>.</i>
<b>mommy</b>	Informal terms for a mother.
<b>nephew</b>	A son of your brother or sister.
<b>niece</b>	A daughter of your brother or sister.
<b>offspring</b>	A person's child or children. <i>She was the mother of many <b>offspring</b>.</i>
<b>parent</b>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>All children are special to those who <b>parent</b> them.</i>
<b>parental</b>	Relating to an animal or plant from which new ones are derived. <i><b>Parental</b> guidance.</i>
<b>paternal</b>	Relating to or characteristic of or befitting a parent. <i>A <b>paternal</b> aunt.</i>
<b>paternity</b>	The kinship relation between an offspring and the father. <i>He refused to admit <b>paternity</b> of the child.</i>
<b>pregnancy</b>	The state of being pregnant; the period from conception to birth when a woman carries a developing fetus in her uterus. <i>A straightforward <b>pregnancy</b>.</i>
<b>progeny</b>	A descendant or the descendants of a person, animal, or plant; offspring. <i>Shorthorn cattle are highly effective in bestowing their characteristics on their <b>progeny</b>.</i>
<b>sibling</b>	A person's brother or sister.
<b>sister</b>	A member of a religious order of women. <i>None of her <b>sisters</b> would betray her.</i>
<b>sisterhood</b>	The feeling of kinship with and closeness to a group of women or all women. <i>Much of <b>sisterhood</b> is about sharing lipsticks.</i>
<b>uncle</b>	The brother of one's father or mother or the husband of one's aunt. <i>He played <b>uncle</b> to lonely students.</i>
