Associations of "Den of iniquity" (30 Words)

aquifer	A body of permeable rock which can contain or transmit groundwater.
basement	The floor of a building which is partly or entirely below ground level. <i>Basement rocks.</i>
burrow	Make a thorough inquiry; investigate. <i>Worms that burrow through dead wood.</i>
cache	Store data in a cache memory. <i>He decided that they must cache their weapons.</i>
cave	Hollow out as if making a cave or opening. <i>She finally caved in the face of his persistence.</i>
cavern	Hollow out as if making a cavern. <i>His eyes were dark caverns.</i>
clandestine	Kept secret or done secretly, especially because illicit. <i>Clandestine intelligence operations.</i>
covert	Being under the protection of her husband. <i>A woman covert.</i>
crypt	A cellar or vault or underground burial chamber (especially beneath a church).
disguised	Concealed or obscured; made unrecognizable. <i>The disguised form of aggression available to the powerless against the powerful.</i>
dripstone	The form of calcium carbonate found in stalactites and stalagmites.
grotto	A small cave (usually with attractive features). <i>Visits to Father Christmas s grotto.</i>
hidden	Difficult to find. <i>Hidden dangers.</i>
injustice	The practice of being unjust or unfair. <i>Brooding over life s injustices.</i>

<u>invisible</u>	Invisible exports and imports. Invisible rays.
lair	A burial plot in a graveyard. <i>Their ashes now lie buried in a lair in the Glasgow necropolis.</i>
miner	A person who works in a mine. <i>The miners were freed after spending four days trapped underground.</i>
secret	Of information given in confidence or in secret. <i>A secret bride.</i>
<u>secretive</u>	(of a person's expression or manner) having an enigmatic or conspiratorial quality. Secretive deals.
stalactite	A cylinder of calcium carbonate hanging from the roof of a limestone cave.
stalagmite	A cylinder of calcium carbonate projecting upward from the floor of a limestone cave.
<u>stealthy</u>	Behaving or done in a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. Stealthy footsteps.
<u>subterranean</u>	Existing, occurring, or done under the earth's surface. <i>The subterranean world of the behind the scenes television power brokers.</i>
surreptitious	Conducted with or marked by hidden aims or methods. <i>Low wages were supplemented by surreptitious payments from tradesmen.</i>
<u>ulterior</u>	Lying beyond what is openly revealed or avowed (especially being kept in the background or deliberately concealed). <i>Without any purpose immediate or ulterior.</i>
<u>undercover</u>	Involving secret work within a community or organization, especially for the purposes of police investigation or espionage. <i>An undercover police operation.</i>
<u>underground</u>	An underground railway especially the one in London. <i>Czech underground literature.</i>
underhanded	With hand brought forward and up from below shoulder level. Underhanded practices.
<u>underneath</u>	On the lower or downward side; on the underside of. <i>A crane lifted slabs of concrete to rescue people trapped underneath.</i>
wickedness	The quality of being disgusting to the senses or emotions. <i>The wickedness of the regime.</i>
