## Associations of "Den of iniquity" (30 Words)

<b>aquifer</b>	A body of permeable rock which can contain or transmit groundwater.
<b>basement</b>	The floor of a building which is partly or entirely below ground level. <i><b>Basement</b> rocks.</i>
<a href="#">burrow</a>	Make a thorough inquiry; investigate. <i>Worms that <b>burrow</b> through dead wood.</i>
<a href="#">cache</a>	Store data in a cache memory. <i>He decided that they must <b>cache</b> their weapons.</i>
<a href="#">cave</a>	Hollow out as if making a cave or opening. <i>She finally <b>caved</b> in the face of his persistence.</i>
<a href="#">cavern</a>	Hollow out as if making a cavern. <i>His eyes were dark <b>caverns</b>.</i>
<b>clandestine</b>	Kept secret or done secretly, especially because illicit. <i><b>Clandestine</b> intelligence operations.</i>
<a href="#">covert</a>	Being under the protection of her husband. <i>A woman <b>covert</b>.</i>
<a href="#">crypt</a>	A cellar or vault or underground burial chamber (especially beneath a church).
<b>disguised</b>	Concealed or obscured; made unrecognizable. <i>The <b>disguised</b> form of aggression available to the powerless against the powerful.</i>
<b>dripstone</b>	The form of calcium carbonate found in stalactites and stalagmites.
<b>grotto</b>	A small cave (usually with attractive features). <i>Visits to Father Christmas s <b>grotto</b>.</i>
<a href="#">hidden</a>	Difficult to find. <i><b>Hidden</b> dangers.</i>
<a href="#">injustice</a>	The practice of being unjust or unfair. <i>Brooding over life s <b>injustices</b>.</i>

<b><u>invisible</u></b>	Invisible exports and imports. <b>Invisible</b> rays.
<b>lair</b>	A burial plot in a graveyard. <i>Their ashes now lie buried in a <b>lair</b> in the Glasgow necropolis.</i>
<b>miner</b>	A person who works in a mine. <i>The <b>miners</b> were freed after spending four days trapped underground.</i>
<b>secret</b>	Of information given in confidence or in secret. <i>A <b>secret</b> bride.</i>
<b><u>secretive</u></b>	(of a person's expression or manner) having an enigmatic or conspiratorial quality. <b>Secretive</b> deals.
<b>stalactite</b>	A cylinder of calcium carbonate hanging from the roof of a limestone cave.
<b>stalagmite</b>	A cylinder of calcium carbonate projecting upward from the floor of a limestone cave.
<b><u>stealthy</u></b>	Behaving or done in a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. <b>Stealthy</b> footsteps.
<b><u>subterranean</u></b>	Existing, occurring, or done under the earth's surface. <i>The <b>subterranean</b> world of the behind the scenes television power brokers.</i>
<b>surreptitious</b>	Conducted with or marked by hidden aims or methods. <i>Low wages were supplemented by <b>surreptitious</b> payments from tradesmen.</i>
<b><u>ulterior</u></b>	Lying beyond what is openly revealed or avowed (especially being kept in the background or deliberately concealed). <i>Without any purpose immediate or <b>ulterior</b>.</i>
<b><u>undercover</u></b>	Involving secret work within a community or organization, especially for the purposes of police investigation or espionage. <i>An <b>undercover</b> police operation.</i>
<b><u>underground</u></b>	An underground railway especially the one in London. <i>Czech <b>underground</b> literature.</i>
<b>underhanded</b>	With hand brought forward and up from below shoulder level. <b>Underhanded</b> practices.
<b><u>underneath</u></b>	On the lower or downward side; on the underside of. <i>A crane lifted slabs of concrete to rescue people trapped <b>underneath</b>.</i>
<b>wickedness</b>	The quality of being disgusting to the senses or emotions. <i>The <b>wickedness</b> of the regime.</i>
